Examination of the proposed CSAs

4. The Bills Committee completed scrutiny of the draft CSAs proposed by the Administration (LC Paper No. CB(1)253/11-12(02) (Revised)).

Mr KAM Nai-wai's proposed amendments

5. The Administration briefed members on its written response (LC Paper No. CB(1)378/11-12(01)) to Mr KAM Nai-wai's proposal of raising the penalties for the offence of driving under the influence of a specified illicit drug (DUISID) and the Administration's considerations. Administration did not accept Mr KAM's proposal to raise the penalties for the offence of DUISID, the Administration advised that it would review the effectiveness of the drug driving provisions after implementation and consider further enhancement or changes as necessary. Dr Philip WONG said that he agreed to the Administration's explanation. No other members commented on Mr KAM's proposed amendments.

Follow-up actions required of the Administration

- Admin 6. <u>The Administration</u> was requested to take the following actions to address concerns raised by members at the meeting
 - (a) to review the rendition of the term "serve" as "腿" in the Chinese text of the proposed amendment to section 69A(2) in clause 14A;
 - (b) to review the use of expression "he or she" (instead of "the person") in the proposed section 39C(11A) in clause 12;
 - (c) to provide information on the penalty terms for drug driving offences in overseas countries and in Hong Kong; and
 - (d) to provide relevant statistics related to drug driving and drink driving offences in the past few years.
