**1. Aberdeen Tourism Project**

At the meeting on 27 April 2009, the Administration proposed to undertake the beautification works of the Aberdeen promenade first, while other elements of the conceptual plan of the Aberdeen Tourism Project, including proposed restaurant facilities at the wholesale fish market, would be further studied. The Panel passed a motion urging the Government to re-consider its decision and implement the Project as soon as possible.

The Administration plans to brief Members on the design and works schedule of the Aberdeen Tourism Project, which comprises improvement works for the promenades on both sides of the Aberdeen Harbour as well as Ap Lei Chau Main Street and adjacent streets with the theme of a fishermen's village.

**2. Update on Hong Kong Disneyland**

The Administration intends to brief members on the operation of the Hong Kong Disneyland in 2009-2010.

**3. Hong Kong Tourism Board Work Plan for 2011-2012**

The Administration will present the work plan of the Hong Kong Tourism Board for 2011-2012 and brief the Panel on the overview of Hong Kong tourism industry in 2010 and the outlook of 2011.

**4. Manpower resources for overseeing consumer protection policies**

The Administration intends to consult members on the manpower resources requirements for overseeing consumer protection policies.

**5. Lei Yue Mun Waterfront Enhancement Project**

With a view to enhancing the attractiveness of Lei Yue Mun (LYM) as a popular tourism spot through further improving the facilities along the LYM waterfront area, the Administration will consult members on the LYM Waterfront Enhancement Project and seek the Panel's support for the proposal.

**6. Funding proposal for the construction of a station for the new weather radar of the Hong Kong Observatory**

The Hong Kong Observatory is acquiring replacement weather radar that provides windshear alerts. The Administration intends to seek, in due course, funding approval for constructing a station housing the new radar. A related submission from a concern group and the Administration's response have been issued for members' information on 31 August 2010 vide LC Paper Nos. CB(1)2786/09-10(01) and (02).

**7. Overall planning of tourism infrastructures**

At the meeting of the Panel on Development (DEV Panel) on 14 October 2010, Hon Paul TSE cited the effort of the government of Singapore in the recent development of Sentosa into a tourist attraction as an example and commented that the Administration should not rely on the initiatives of the commercial sector for the long-term planning of tourism infrastructures but take the lead in the overall planning of tourism infrastructure in Hong Kong.

In line with the "user pays" principle, the Administration proposes to lower certain fees charged by the Marine Department, as one of the measures to enhance the competitiveness of the Hong Kong Port and the maritime industry.

The Administration has been requested to update members on the progress of development of the logistics cluster and LLP in due course.

**14. Proposed enactment of a new regulation under the Merchant Shipping (Seafarers) Ordinance and amendments to other existing regulations**

The International Labour Organization (ILO) adopted the Maritime Labour Convention, 2006 (MLC 2006) to consolidate

and update over 60 ILO instruments relating to the working conditions and welfare of seafarers. MLC 2006 is expected to commence operation in 2012. The Administration proposes to update the relevant local legislation to prepare for the implementation of MLC 2006.

**15. Proposed provision of customs, immigration and quarantine facilities for SkyPier of the Hong Kong International Airport**

The Administration plans to brief the Panel on the proposal before seeking funding approval from the Public Works Subcommittee and FC.

**16. Development of seaplane service and mooring areas for pleasure vessels**

At the meeting on 15 October 2009, Hon Albert CHAN requested the Administration to explore and discuss with the Panel the development of seaplane service between Hong Kong and other cities in the region, as well as the provision of more mooring areas for pleasure vessels, having regard to the demand for the facilities and in the light of overseas experiences.

**17. Annual tariff reviews with the two power companies**

Pursuant to the Scheme of Control Agreements with the two power companies, a tariff review will be conducted jointly by the Government and the respective power company towards the end of each year. The two power companies will announce their tariff for 2011 after the review and present to the Panel if there is any adjustment.
