Note: (1) The Government announced in March 2011 that the one-off measures to be implemented under the 2011-2012 Budget will be adjusted, resulting in a forecasted deficit of HK\$8.5 billion instead of a surplus of HK\$3.9 billion in the Consolidated Account for the 2011-2012 financial year. While it is still unknown whether the above change would affect the GDP estimate for that financial year, this figure of consolidated surplus/deficit as a percentage of GDP is calculated based on the GDP estimate released by the Government on 23 February 2011.
