- 3. <u>The Bills Committee</u> requested the Administration to provide the following information -

- (a) the number of cases that officers of the Buildings Department ("BD") had failed to enter premises and details of such cases;
- (b) the number of cases that BD's officers had broken into premises as authorized by section 22 of the Buildings Ordinance;
- (c) whether an owner or occupier of a premises had the right to respond to the Building Authority's application to the court for a warrant to enter his/her premises and the procedures for the aggrieved owner/occupier to follow up;
- (d) the reason for the long time required for the demolition of the unauthorized building works in the Ma Tau Wai fire incident case and the Larch Street case; and
- (e) the procedures for carrying out special operations to inspect buildings by BD after major incidents.
- 4. <u>The Bills Committee</u> agreed to receive views from deputations on the Bill at the next meeting. The Clerk would consult members on the list of organizations to be invited.
- 5. <u>The Bills Committee</u> also agreed that the Development Bureau should coordinate the representative of the Fire Services Department ("FSD") to attend meetings when issues related to FSD were discussed.

- 6. <u>The Chairman</u> asked the Clerk to schedule the next two meetings, one to receive views from the deputations and another one for discussion with the Administration, in consultation with him.
