Council meeting of 8 February 2012

**Amendments to motion on
“Formulating an industrial policy”**

Further to LC Paper No. CB(3) 361/11-12 issued on 27 January 2012, Hon IP Wai-ming and Hon Ronny TONG have respectively given notices of their intention to move separate amendments to Hon Andrew LEUNG’s motion on “Formulating an industrial policy” scheduled for the Council meeting of 8 February 2012. As directed by the President, Hon IP Wai-ming’s and Hon Ronny TONG’s amendments will be printed in the terms in which they were handed in on the Agenda of the Council.

2. The President will order a joint debate on the above motion and the two amendments. To assist Members in debating the motion and amendments, I set out below the procedure to be followed during the debate:

- (a) the President calls upon Hon Andrew LEUNG to speak and move his motion;
- (b) the President proposes the question on Hon Andrew LEUNG’s motion;
- (c) the President calls upon the two Members, who intend to move amendments, to speak in the following order, but no amendment is to be moved at this stage:

- (i) Hon IP Wai-ming; and
- (ii) Hon Ronny TONG;
- (d) the President calls upon the designated public officer(s) to speak;
- (e) the President invites other Members to speak;
- (f) the President gives leave to Hon Andrew LEUNG to speak for the second time on the two amendments;
- (g) the President calls upon the designated public officer(s) again to speak;
- (h) in accordance with Rule 34(5) of the Rules of Procedure, the President has decided that he will call upon the two Members to move their respective amendments in the order set out in paragraph (c) above. The President invites Hon IP Wai-ming to move his amendment to the motion, and forthwith proposes and puts to vote the question on the amendment;
- (i) after Hon IP Wai-ming's amendment has been voted upon, the President deals with Hon Ronny TONG's amendment to the motion; and
- (j) after Hon Ronny TONG's amendment has been dealt with, the President calls upon Hon Andrew LEUNG to reply. Thereafter, the President puts to vote the question on Hon Andrew LEUNG's motion, or his motion as amended, as the case may be.

3. For Members' ease of reference, the terms of the original motion and of the motion, if amended, are set out in the **Appendix**.

**Motion debate on
“Formulating an industrial policy”
to be held at the Council meeting of 8 February 2011**

1. Hon Andrew LEUNG’s original motion

That this Council urges the SAR Government to formulate a comprehensive policy to promote high value-adding, new technology-intensive and innovative industries, so as to ensure Hong Kong’s long-term economic development.

2. Motion as amended by Hon IP Wai-ming

That, *since the nineties of the last century, the massive northward relocation of factories created a structural problem of industrial imbalance in Hong Kong and large numbers of grass-roots and skilled workers became unemployed or underemployed due to industrial shrinkage, the unhealthy phenomenon of society relying solely on a handful of industries to support its economy has progressively emerged; in order to ease the problem concerned and develop industrial diversification,* this Council urges the SAR Government to formulate a comprehensive policy to promote high value-adding, new technology-intensive and innovative industries *as well as industries capable of sustainable development and creating massive employment opportunities, and at the same time, re-design the relevant manpower training, including reviewing the Apprenticeship Ordinance and extending the relevant system to various emerging industries, as well as providing land and financial facilitation and support to emerging industries,* so as to ensure Hong Kong’s long-term economic development *and different employment opportunities for local workers.*

Note: Hon IP Wai-ming’s amendment is marked in *bold and italic type*.

3. Motion as amended by Hon Ronny TONG

That this Council urges the SAR Government to formulate a comprehensive policy to promote high value-adding, new technology-intensive and innovative industries, *create a favourable environment conducive to setting up businesses, promote better employment relationship, and expeditiously study setting standard working hours and standardizing the number of general*

holidays for the relevant trades, so as to ensure Hong Kong's long-term economic development.
