Planning of Council business to be dealt with at Council meetings before 18 July 2012

Purpose

This paper summarizes the items of business scheduled to be dealt with at Council meetings before the Legislative Council ("LegCo") is to stand prorogued from 18 July 2012. It also provides a tentative plan for the handling of these items of business at the five Council meetings for the period from 13 June 2012 to 17 July 2012.

Background

2. At the House Committee meeting on 1 June 2012, Members noted the large amount of business carried over from previous Council meetings, including many important bills and motions involving people's livelihood. Members were concerned whether there would be sufficient time to deal with all the Council business before the prorogation of the Council on 18 July 2012.

3. Members also noted that owing to the need to follow the order of business set out in Rule 18 of the Rules of Procedure, it had not been possible for those Members' motions to extend the scrutiny period of subsidiary legislation to be dealt with before Government bills and Government motions. Noting that more bills would be scheduled for resumption of Second Reading debate, it had become even more difficult for Members' motions to be moved to repeal or amend subsidiary legislation or to extend the scrutiny period within the specific timeframe. Members were aware that the order of business for a Council meeting had been specified in Rule 18 of the Rules of Procedure (**Appendix I**) and the President must give priority to Government bills for inclusion in the agenda when deciding on the agenda of a Council meeting in accordance with Article 72(2) of the Basic Law.

4. To assist the House Committee to understand the extent of difficulties faced by the Council in completing its work before the prorogation on 18 July 2012, the Secretariat was requested to make an assessment of the time required for the handling of each item of business with a view to working out the number of days the Council ought to meet between now and the last Council meeting of 11 July 2012.

Items of business to be dealt with at Council meetings

5. The items of business to be dealt with at these five meetings include the unfinished business carried over from the Council meetings of 2 May, 9 May, 16 May, 23 May, 30 May and 6 June as well as the new items of business scheduled for June and July 2012. Based on the information provided by committee clerks, a total of about 129 hours will be required to complete the legislative process of all the bills which notice has been or will be given for resumption of Second Reading debate and for moving motions on subsidiary legislation at Council meetings. There are also Members' business, such as questions, committee reports, motions on committee reports and Members' motions with no legislative effect, etc. This will take up another 93 hours based on the average time taken for similar debates and items of business. A summary setting out all the items of business which need to be dealt with at Council meetings before the Council stands prorogued is given in **Appendix II**.

Tentative plan to complete the Council's work before prorogation

6. For the Council meeting of 6 June 2012, the President has decided that the meeting will last for three days with breaks for meetings with District Councils on 7 June 2012 and for meetings of the House Committee and the Finance Committee on 8 June 2012. After 8 June 2012, there will be five more Council meetings before the legislative session ends on 17 July 2012. To provide sufficient time for the Council to deal with all the items of business included in Appendix II, it will be necessary for the Council to meet on more days for each of the five remaining Council meetings, and to clear as far as possible all Government bills and motions before the end of the second last Council meeting of 4 July 2012 and reserve the last Council meeting of 11 July 2012 mainly for Members' business. 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Extract from the Rules of Procedure *

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PART C **ARRANGEMENT OF BUSINESS**

18. Order of Business at a Meeting

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(1) The business of each meeting other than a meeting under Rule 8 (Attendance of the Chief Executive) or Rule 13 (The Chief Executive's Policy Address), or the first meeting of a term or a meeting to elect the President shall be transacted in the following order:

> Administration of oath or affirmation. (a)

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- Obituary and other ceremonial speeches. (b)
- Reading by the President of messages and announcements by the (c) President.
- Presentation of petitions. (d)
- Laying on the Table of papers and of reports of committees. (e)
- (f) Asking and answering of questions put to the Government.
- Statements by designated public officers. (g)
- Personal explanations. (h)
- (i) Government bills.
- (j) Government motions other than those specified in paragraph (ja). (L.N. 245 of 2009)
- Government motions on subsidiary legislation and other instruments (ja) (L.N. 245 of 2009) made under an Ordinance.
- Members' motions on subsidiary legislation and other instruments (jb) made under an Ordinance. (L.N. 245 of 2009)
- Members' bills. (k)
- (1) Members' motions other than those specified in paragraph (jb). (L.N. 245 of 2009)
- (m) Requests for leave under Rule 89 (Procedure for Obtaining Leave for Member to Attend as Witness in Civil Proceedings) and Rule 90 (Procedure for Obtaining Leave to Give Evidence of Council Proceedings).
- Proceedings under Rule 16(4) (Motions for the Adjournment of (n) the Council).

(2) The items of business mentioned in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (g) and (h) of subrule (1) shall not require notice; but with the exception of items (a) and (c) they shall not be entered upon save with the previous leave of the President.
