(issued on 2 February 2012)

- (a) advise the existing monitoring system to ensure that bus trips provided by franchised bus companies were on schedule;
- (b) advise the percentage of bus trips which failed to meet the schedules of services (using the 18 Districts as the basis), and the reasons for not meeting the schedule (such as non-attendance of bus drivers); and
- (c) enhance the existing monitoring system, consideration should be given to putting in place an electronic system so as to enable the Commissioner for Transport and the franchised bus companies to gather data immediately on the situation of scheduled bus trips arriving at each bus stop and whether they met the schedules of services.
- 6. <u>Members</u> agreed to invite franchised bus companies to the next meeting scheduled for Tuesday, 21 February 2012, at 4:30 pm to discuss the measures that had been taken and would be taken to ensure that the bus trips were on schedule.

(*Post-meeting note*: On the instruction of the Chairman, the meeting was subsequently re-scheduled for Thursday, 23 February 2012, at 10:45 am. The Chairman would also move a resolution to extend the period for amending the Six Orders from 29 February to 21 March 2012.)
