- 4. <u>The Subcommittee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).
- 5. <u>The Administration</u> briefed members on the Prevention of Bribery Ordinance (Amendment of Schedules 1 and 2) Order 2012 (the Order).

Discussion

- 6. <u>Members</u> expressed the following major views and concerns about the Order at the meeting
 - (a) differences between designating and not designating the four organisations (i.e. Hong Kong Internet Registration Corporation Limited (HKIRC), Hong Kong Domain Name Registration Company Limited (HKDNR); Hong Kong Applied Science and Technology Research Institute Company Limited; and Hong Kong Cyberport Management Company Limited) as public bodies under the Prevention of Bribery Ordinance (Cap. 201) (the Ordinance); and
 - (b) whether the above four organizations had contracted out any core operations and, if so, whether the outsourced contractors concerned should also be subject to a level of probity.
- 7. To facilitate further discussion on the Order, the Administration was requested to provide the following information
 - (a) a table comparing the differences of designating and not designating the four organisations as public bodies with reference to each of the relevant sections of the Ordinance;
 - (b) report of the assignment study conducted in 2007 by the Independent Commission Against Corruption (ICAC) on HKIRC and HKDNR;
 - (c) rights of HKIRC's ordinary members, including whether they could override the decisions made by the Board of Directors; and

(d) response to a member's view that contractors engaged by the four organizations should also be added to Schedule 1 of the Ordinance when they were engaged to perform any of the core functions of the public bodies.

Legislative timetable

8. <u>Members</u> agreed that the Chairman of the Subcommittee should move a motion at the Council meeting on 18 April 2012 to extend the scrutiny period of the Order to 9 May 2012. In this connection, the deadline for giving notice of amendments to the Order would be 2 May 2012.

9. <u>Members</u> agreed to hold the next meeting on 13 April 2012 and representatives of the ICAC should be invited to attend the next meeting.
