**6. Progress Report on the Phasing Out Programme of Housing for Senior Citizens**

The vacancy rate of Housing for Senior Citizens (HSC) Type 1 design has been high since late 1990s in view of the increasing applicants' preference for self-contained public housing units. A phasing out programme to convert some vacant HSC Type 1 units into normal public housing flats has been implemented since 2006, and subsequently been extended to all HSC Type 1 units in March 2011. The Administration would review the programme in March 2012 and would like to brief members on its progress and effectiveness.
