I. Matter arising from the last meeting

(LC Paper No. CB(4)619/12-13(01) — Letter dated 2 May 2013 from Dr Hon Helena WONG Pikwan to the Chairman of Subcommittee on Integrated Education containing the wording of a motion)

At the invitation of the Chairman, <u>Dr Helena WONG</u> explained her motion (at **Annex I**) to the meeting.

- 2. At the invitation of the Chairman, <u>Under Secretary for Education</u> ("US(Ed)") said that the Education Bureau ("EDB") had the responsibility for provision of education services. It had kept the implementation of integrated education ("IE") under ongoing review and introduced improvements where necessary and practicable. EDB would continue to collaborate with relevant government bureaux/departments responsible for other policy areas such as medical and rehabilitation services in providing support for students with special educational needs ("SEN students"). <u>US(Ed)</u> re-affirmed that the Administration would continue to listen to the views of the Subcommittee.
- 3. <u>The Chairman</u> put Dr WONG's motion to vote. Seven members voted for the motion and no member voted against. <u>The Chairman</u> declared that the motion was passed.

The Administration/Hong Kong Examinations and Assessment Authority ("HKEAA") were asked to provide information, where available, on the number of SEN students taking Liberal Studies in the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education ("HKDSE") Examination and their performance in comparison with non-SEN students in the HKDSE Examination of 2012 and 2013.
- 7. Mr Abraham SHEK suggested that the Subcommittee should invite the Equal Opportunities Commission ("EOC") to provide a paper setting out its views on the implementation of IE, similar to its written report on equal educational opportunities for ethnic minority students. The Chairman agreed to consider his suggestion.

(*Post-meeting note*: As EOC had briefed the Subcommittee on the findings of its "Study on Equal Learning opportunities for Students with Disabilities under the Integrated Education System" at the meeting held on 19 February 2013 and provided a paper on the subject, the Chairman decided that it was not necessary at this juncture to request EOC to produce another paper on the same subject.)

- 8. The Chairman informed the meeting that the Panel on Welfare Services had scheduled a meeting on 10 June 2013 to receive deputations' views on "the planning and inadequate provision of rehabilitation services for preschool children". He said that if any of the deputations were interested in giving views on the subject, they could request to attend the aforesaid meeting.
- 9. With the agreement of the Subcommittee, the meeting was extended up to 8:50 p.m.
