Arrangements for the frequency spectrum in the 1.9-2.2 GHz band upon expiry of the existing frequency assignments for 3G mobile services	4.2.2013	The Administration was requested to provide a written response to the joint submission from the four mobile network operators dated 1 February 2013 regarding arrangements for the frequency spectrum in the 1.9-2.2 GHz band upon expiry of the existing frequency assignments for 3G mobile services.	The Administration has subsequently advised that as the consultation exercise is still ongoing and the deadline for responses has just been extended to 11 April 2013, the Administration would examine all the views and comments received in mapping out the way forward. The decision on the arrangements on spectrum re-assignment would be announced through a formal Statement as soon as practicable three years before expiry of the current spectrum assignment, viz. by October 2013. The Administration would set out its responses and feedback to the submissions received during the consultation, including those from the incumbent operators, in that Statement, a copy of which would be provided to the Panel once issued.
