Action

I. Confirmation of minutes

(LC Paper No. CB(2)638/12-13)

<u>The Joint Subcommittee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at **Annex**).

2. The minutes of the meeting held on 29 January 2013 were confirmed.

II. The approved Development Plan of the West Kowloon Cultural District

(LC Paper Nos. CB(2)658/12-13(01) & (02))

- 3. With the aid of a powerpoint presentation, the West Kowloon Cultural District Authority ("WKCDA") briefed the Joint Subcommittee on the approved Development Plan ("DP") of the West Kowloon Cultural District ("WKCD") and its implementation progress. Members noted that WKCDA submitted DP to the Town Planning Board for consideration on 30 December 2011 and the draft WKCD DP was approved by the Chief Executive-in-Council on 8 January 2013. Members were advised that WKCDA had embarked on the design process for the future facilities in WKCD, the first batch being the park, the Xiqu Centre and M+, for commencement of construction as soon as possible.
- 4. <u>Mr MA Fung-kwok</u> declared that he was a member of the Board of WKCDA.

- 5. <u>The Joint Subcommittee</u> requested the Administration/WKCDA to provide/respond in writing to the following -
 - (a) a three-dimensional plan showing the building height profile of future developments in WKCD;
 - (b) information on the measures/facilities to be put in place to enhance pedestrian accessibility to and within WKCD, as well as to improve the connectivity of WKCD with its neighbouring districts (in particular Yau Ma Tei and Jordan areas);
 - (c) information to explain whether the approved DP and the key development parameters of WKCD could be amended and if so, the procedures required for making such applications;
 - (d) response to a member's suggestion that the Administration/WKCDA should consider increasing the maximum plot ratio for the WKCD site, say, from 1.81 to 3;
 - (e) information on the purposes of and timetable for the consultancy study to be commissioned by WKCDA as referred to in the Administration's paper (LC Paper No. CB(2)658/12-13(01)), as well as whether and how the public and the Legislative Council Members would be engaged in the study;

- (f) explanations as to whether, and to what extent, the aforementioned study would impact upon the current works projects being undertaken by WKCDA;
- (g) information on how the type/mix of retail, dining and entertainment uses in WKCD would be determined and whether preference would be given to small local business operators;
- (h) advice on whether designated areas/facilities would be provided to local young budding artists and small-sized arts groups to stage performances in WKCD, and if so, the relevant details; and
- (i) response to the concerns raised by some members about air ventilation and air quality in WKCD and a view that on-shore electricity supply should be provided for cruises berthing at the Ocean Terminal so as to reduce emissions from the cruises which would affect the air quality in WKCD.

(Members agreed to extend the meeting for 15 minutes.)

III. Xiqu Centre design competition

(LC Paper Nos. CB(2)658/11-12(03) & (04))

- 6. With the aid of a powerpoint presentation, <u>WKCDA</u> briefed the Joint Subcommittee on the process and result of the design competition for the Xiqu Centre of WKCD. <u>Members</u> noted that WKCDA had appointed the winning design team, BTA & RLP Company Limited, as the design consultant for the Xiqu Centre project and a detailed design was being prepared for the Xiqu Centre (Phase I) scheduled for completion in 2016.
- 7. <u>Members</u> in general expressed grave concern that the estimated cost for the Xiqu Centre (Phase I) and related facilities based on the chosen design stood at HK\$2.7 billion, more than double the cost estimate for the relevant parts of the Xiqu Centre in 2006. <u>The Joint Subcommittee</u> requested the Administration/WKCDA to provide/respond in writing to the following -

- (a) detailed explanations for the substantial increase in the estimated cost for the Xiqu Centre, including the extent to which the cost increase was caused by construction cost escalation and/or a revision/enhancement of the project scope;
- (b) a breakdown of the latest cost estimate of HK\$2.7 billion and advice on whether and how the cost could be reduced;

- (c) information on the financial arrangements considered/to be adopted by WKCDA to ensure completion of the planned facilities in WKCD within the approved upfront endowment of HK\$21.6 billion;
- (d) advice on whether WKCDA had made known to the shortlisted design teams the estimated cost for the Xiqu Centre and related facilities in 2006 (i.e. HK\$1.3 billion);
- (e) response to members' suggestion to review the weighting of the assessment criteria to be adopted for the forthcoming design competitions for WKCD, given that the weighting of "cost aspect/value for money" in assessing the design submissions was only 10%;
- (f) information on the role and involvement of the Government in monitoring the conduct of the Xiqu Centre design competition and the measures adopted by WKCDA to contain the cost of the Xiqu Centre;
- (g) an account of the background leading to the decision of WKCDA to adopt "Xiqu Centre" as the English name for "戲曲中心" and advice on whether the English name would be changed; and
- (h) information on the future mode of operation of the Xiqu Centre, including whether and how an artistic accountability system would be implemented.
- 8. In response to members' concern about the financial situation of the WKCD project, WKCDA undertook to consult the Joint Subcommittee on the proposed alternative financing options for the project when ready.

(Members agreed to extend the meeting for a further 15 minutes.)

IV. Work plan of the Joint Subcommittee

(LC Paper No. CB(2)658/12-13(05))

9. <u>The Chairman</u> informed members that pursuant to the discussion of the Joint Subcommittee at its last meeting on 29 January 2013 and the informal
