2. <u>The Subcommittee</u> received oral representations from five deputations on the subsidiary legislation.

Way forward

3. <u>The Chairman</u> concluded that the Subcommittee had completed scrutiny of the subsidiary legislation. Both the Subcommittee and the Administration would not propose any amendments to the subsidiary legislation.

4. In respect of the concerns about the tax treatment of lump sum spectrum utilization fee payment, <u>members</u> agreed that the matter should be dealt with separately by the Panel on Financial Affairs ("FA Panel").

(*Post-meeting note:* The Secretariat had referred the matter to the FA Panel on 17 July 2014 for its follow-up.)

5. <u>Members</u> noted that the Chairman would move a motion at the Council meeting of 18 June 2014 to extend the scrutiny period of the subsidiary legislation to the Council meeting of 9 July 2014. They also noted that the date of the Subcommittee's reporting to the House Committee and the deadline for giving notice of motion to amend the subsidiary legislation were 27 June and 2 July 2014 respectively.

(*Post-meeting note:* The Chairman had given notice in his individual capacity to move a proposed resolution under section 34(2) of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Cap. 1) to amend the Telecommunications (Method for Determining Spectrum Utilization Fee) (Administratively Assigned Spectrum in the 1.9-2.2 GHz Band) Regulation at the Council meeting of 9 July 2014. The President ruled that the proposed resolution could be moved. However, the said meeting did not deal with the proposed resolution ultimately. The Three Regulations under the Telecommunications Ordinance (Cap. 106) Gazetted on 16 May 2014 came into operation on 11 July 2014 without any amendment.)
