- explain the rationale for fixing the commencement date of the (a) proposed resolution on the 14th day after the date on which the Finance Committee approves the financial proposal relating to the establishment of the new Innovation and Technology Bureau ("ITB"), or on the 14th day after the date on which the proposed resolution is made and passed by the Council, whichever date is later;
- in relation to item (a), consider extending the 14 day deadline to allow (b) sufficient time for the preparation work relating to the establishment of the ITB, including the appointment of a suitable candidate for the post

of Secretary for Innovation and Technology; and

(c) consider amending paragraphs (3)(d)(ii),(3)(d)(iv) and (3)(e) of the proposed resolution to spell out clearly that the matters mentioned are confined to the transfer of statutory functions under the Electronics Transaction Ordinance (Cap. 553) pursuant to the establishment of the ITB.

Follow-up actions to be taken by the Secretariat

4. <u>The Secretariat</u> was requested to compile the relevant papers relating to the discussions on the proposed establishment of the Innovation and Technology Bureau at different committees.

Sharing a similar view, Mr Christopher CHUNG enquired about the rationale for not transferring the telecommunications and broadcasting portfolios under CEDB to the ITB. The Administration advised that the new ITB would focus on the development of innovation and technology in Hong Kong, including the commercialization of research and development ("R&D") deliverables. The telecommunications and broadcasting portfolios were more related to regulatory and licensing matters and hence not proposed to be transferred to the ITB. Nevertheless, the Administration did not rule out the possibility of reorganizing the functions of the ITB in light of new developments. Mr WONG Kwok-hing enquired about the work of the new ITB on coordination with tertiary institutions to foster the development of R&D. The Administration advised that the ITB would be in a better position to strengthen the linkages among stakeholders, including the Government, the

Mr CHUNG Kwok-pan opined that it would be unfair for S for IT, who would only be responsible for the development of innovation and technology, to be entitled to the same remuneration as other Policy Secretaries, such as the Secretary for Commerce and Economic Development ("SCED") and the Secretary for Housing and Transport, who had to shoulder heavier policy responsibilities. 		The Administration advised that the objective of the establishment of the ITB was to recognize the importance of innovation and technology to Hong Kong's development, and to provide dedicated high level leadership in the development of innovation and technology. The workload of S for IT should not be seen only from the number of policy aspects for which the ITB was responsible. As the number of stakeholders involved in the innovation and technology industry was substantial, it would not be an easy task for S for IT to achieve the balance of interests among stakeholders. S for IT also played a leading role in undertaking this mammoth task to promote the commercialization of R&D deliverables.

Sharing a similar view, Mr Alan LEONG expressed concern that there might not be sufficient time for appointment of a suitable and qualified candidate for the post of S for IT. The Chairman and Ms Claudia MO shared a similar concern. Members enquired whether the Administration would consider extending the 14th day deadline to allow sufficient time for preparation work.	required
		The Administration explained that as the process of obtaining the approval of FC for the financial proposal and the legislative process for the proposed resolution were separate proceedings in parallel and the dates of their completion were unknown yet, the commencement date of the proposed resolution was therefore set on a day after both processes had been completed. The Administration considered that setting the commencement date as the 14th day after the date on which the Administration obtained the approval of FC, or the 14th day after the passage of the proposed resolution, whichever was the later, was appropriate. This had taken into account the time required for the preparation work relating to the establishment of the ITB, including the deployment of supporting staff and appointment of the Principal Official. The Administration was confident that, with its best endeavours, it would complete in good time all preparation for the new ITB to commence operation.

		The Administration advised that with a more focused purview, the ITB would be best placed to explore possible measures to encourage R&D investment with the industry and other bureaux, including CEDB.

The Administration advised that as all the existing 21 permanent directorate officers at D2 and above in the Communications and Technology Branch of CEDB, ITC and OGCIO were already fully engaged in their respective portfolios, it was operationally not feasible for any of them to be redeployed to take up the new policy responsibilities of the ITB. Mr CHAN Chi-chuen's proposals for redeployment was deemed not feasible, as the normal set up of a bureau should consist of the political team and the civil service team specializing in their respective spheres of responsibilities. Nevertheless, the future ITB would review its operational requirements from time to time as in the cases of all bureaux and departments.

		The Administration advised that the proposed resolution would be moved under section 54A of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance ("IGCO") (Cap. 1). In light of the general principles of interpretation provided in section 19 of IGCO, paragraph (3) of the proposed resolution, which were the savings and transitional provisions relating to the transfer of the statutory functions in paragraph (2) of the proposed resolution, must be interpreted in such a way that was consistent with that transfer and could not fall outside the ambit as permitted by section 54A(2) of IGCO. It also followed that the matters provided in paragraph (3) of the proposed resolution were made pursuant to or in connection with the transfer of statutory functions under the ETO, and hence, were related and confined to the ETO. Nevertheless, the Administration would give consideration to making suitable amendments to spell out more clearly that the matters mentioned were confined to those relating to the ETO. 		mentioned by ALA7 did exist, and opined that there was a need to improve the drafting to clearly reflect the legislative intent.	
		Having considered the legal adviser's concern that certain matters dealt with in paragraphs (3)(d)(iii) and (v) were not provided in the ETO, the Administration agreed to remove these paragraphs from the proposed resolution. The Administration would submit the revised draft resolution to the Subcommittee for consideration.
