005227 - 010222	ALA Administration Chairman	In response to Assistant Legal Adviser's enquiry, the Administration explained that non-compliance with the Additional Safety Requirements Regulation would constitute an offence under section 8 of the Ordinance, which would be subject to the penalties under section 31 of the Ordinance and the statutory defence under section 8(7) of the Ordinance. Depending on the circumstances in individual cases, the common law defence of honest and mistaken belief might be available to a person charged with an offence under the Ordinance. Relevant information was detailed in LC Paper Nos. CB(2)1017/13-14(01) - (03), 1044/13-14(01) and 1065/13-14(01).	•

She enquired about whether the Mainland had implemented control of phthalates in toys and children's products.  Members noted that the safety of toys and specified children's products was subject to the regulatory control of the Ordinance and regulations made under it. A toy/children's product supplied in Hong Kong, irrespective of its place of manufacture, had to comply with the applicable standards or requirements under the Ordinance and the regulations thereunder.  The Administration's advice that the Additional Safety Requirements Regulation sought to impose	
		concentration limits of phthalates in toys and children's products to ensure that Hong Kong's regime was on par with those in the advanced economies in protecting local children from exposure to phthalates. All toys and children's products imported to and supplied in Hong Kong, irrespective of their places of manufacture, had to comply with the additional safety standards or requirements in the Additional Safety Requirements Regulation upon its implementation. The Administration would consider strengthening public education on the possible health hazards posed to children by phthalates that might be contained in plasticized materials in toys and children's products in collaboration with the Consumer Council.  At the request of Dr Helena WONG, the Administration would provide information on whether the Mainland has implemented control of phthalates in toys and children's products.
