
Evolution of laundry facility design

• Pole holders are provided for most of the estates completed before 2005.



Evolution of laundry facility design

• The balcony ceiling of flats in most of the Standard block types are usually installed with alternate racks or hangers.



Evolution of laundry facility design

• Since 2011, laundry rods have become standard provisions.



Background

- Subsidy scheme launched in 2004/2005 to convert laundry pole holders to stainless steel racks (tenants contributed \$200).
- Free installation of laundry racks for all-elderly families upon request and physically disabled persons subject to advice from medical practitioners.
- Tenants may apply for installation of approved types of laundry racks according to HD guidelines.

The Proposal

- Convert pole holders to cord-pulley type laundry racks on a subsidy basis to improve the living standard. (Amount of subsidy: HA to contribute about \$1,500 and tenants will pay \$300)
- Designs to comply with Building (Minor Works) Regulation.
- Parallel type as 1st choice and perpendicular type if space reentrants does not permit. Stainless steel racks are used given its durability.
- Exact width and position of laundry rack will suit the condition of individual estates.

Programme and Coverage

> Applicable to all public rental flats with pole holders.

Proactive survey on tenants' intention to replace with a new rack.

 \geq All installation works to complete in about 2 years.

> Tentatively no end date for the Subsidy Scheme.

Advantages of the Subsidy Scheme

1. Environmentally friendly without wastage

Provide to those who need only (many tenants prefer to use balcony ceiling hangers, harmony block tenants prefer to use approved laundry rods outside living rooms). (photo)

2. Spending public money prudently

A total replacement will spend HA fund over \$900M (not recommended).

3. Ensure compliance with Building (Minor Works) Regulation

Tenants may procure device or works that are not in compliance with the Regulation. Replacement arrangement made by the HD's can ensure the quality and durability.

Exemption from Payment

> Exemption of \$300 payment:

- (a) for families with all elderly members over 60;
- (b) for disabled persons recommended by medical practitioners;
- (c) for families receiving Comprehensive Social Security Assistance; and


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(d) for families under Rent Assistance Scheme.


Way Forward

Subject to endorsement of Subsidised Housing Committee under the Housing Authority, the proposed Subsidy Scheme is expected to launch in 2014/15.
