INTRODUCTION

Section 19(1A)(a) of the Pesticides Ordinance (Cap. 133) provides that the Chief Executive in Council (CE-in-Council) may by regulation provide for fees and charges.

- 2. Section 3(1) of the Public Health (Animals and Birds) Ordinance (Cap. 139) provides that CE-in-Council may by regulation provide for matters as set out in sub-sections (a) to (t). Section 3(4)(e) further provides that regulations made under section 3 may prescribe the fees to be paid in respect of, inter alia, any licence or permit.
- 3. Section 29A of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Cap. 1) empowers the Financial Secretary (which means also the Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury (SFST) by virtue of section 3 of Cap. 1) to vary fees which are specified in subsidiary legislation made by CE-in-Council.
- 4. In exercise of these powers, SFST has made the following subsidiary legislation
 - (a) Pesticides (Amendment) Regulation 2014 at **Annex A**;

- (b) Public Health (Animals and Birds) (Exhibitions) (Amendment) Regulation 2014 at **Annex B**; and
- (c) Public Health (Animals) (Riding Establishment) (Amendment) Regulation 2014 at **Annex C**,

to revise the fees specified in the Pesticides Regulations (Cap. 133A) made under the Pesticides Ordinance, as well as the Public Health (Animals and Birds) (Exhibitions) Regulations (Cap. 139F) and the Public Health (Animals) (Riding Establishment) Regulations (Cap. 139J) made under the Public Health (Animals and Birds) Ordinance.

JUSTIFICATIONS

- 5. In line with the "user pays" principle, it is government policy that fees charged by the Government for various services should in general be set at levels sufficient to recover the full costs of providing the services. The Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD) has reviewed a total of 18 fee items prescribed in the Pesticides Regulations, the Public Health (Animals and Birds) (Exhibitions) Regulations and the Public Health (Animals) (Riding Establishment) Regulations. Among these fee items, 16 were last revised in 1997 and two in 2006. The result of costing review showed that the current cost recovery levels of these 18 fee items range from 31.4% to 83.9% which are not adequate to recover the full costs of providing the relevant services. In order to achieve full cost recovery gradually and avoid a steep fee increase, we have adopted the following guidelines for the fee revision in our proposal
 - (a) for items with an existing cost recovery rate of less than 40%, adopt an increase of about 20%;
 - (b) for items with an existing cost recovery rate of 40% to 70%, adopt an increase of about 15%; and
 - (c) for items with an existing cost recovery rate of over 70%, adopt an increase of about 10% or less.
- 6. Accordingly, the 18 fee items have to be adjusted with increases ranging from about 9% to 20%. With the increased fee levels, the cost

recovery rates will be improved to the range of 37.6% to 92.6%. Details of the fee adjustments are set out at **Annex D**.

THE AMENDMENT REGULATIONS

7. The Amendment Regulations at **Annexes A to C** revise the 18 fee items concerned and will come into effect on 31 October 2014.

EFFICIENCY IMPROVEMENT MEASURES

9. AFCD will continue to enhance efficiency and streamline procedures so as to contain the costs of providing such services to the public.

IMPLICATIONS OF THE FEE ADJUSTMENTS

10. If the adjustments to the 18 fee items are implemented, the estimated increase in revenue is about \$0.1 million per annum. Given that the fee adjustments are not significant, we expect that impact of the fee adjustments to the affected parties should be minimal. The Amendment Regulations do not affect the current binding effect of the respective principal Ordinances and Regulations referred to in paragraph 4 above.

PUBLIC CONSULTATION

11. The existing licensees and permittees under the three Regulations have been informed of the fee revision proposal. So far,

AFCD has received feedback from two persons. One of them indicated support for the proposed fee revision while the other one considered that the Administration should continue to freeze the fees at their present level.

12. We consulted the Panel on Food Safety and Environmental Hygiene of the Legislative Council on 11 February 2014 on the proposal to adjust the relevant fees. The Panel expressed no objection to the fee revision proposal.

PUBLICITY

13. The Amendment Regulations will be published in the Gazette on 6 June 2014. A spokesperson will be available to answer media enquiries.
