 - (a) in respect of the term "on a commercial basis" under clause 5(1) of the Bill, whether the term "according to prudent commercial principles" used in section 6 of the Airport Authority Ordinance (Cap. 483) would be adopted instead, and if not, the reason(s);
 - (b) the relationship among the Government, the terminal operator and the Commissioner for Tourism ("the Commissioner"), in particular the role of and statutory powers conferred to the Commissioner, as far as the tenancy agreement signed between the Government and the terminal operator for the operation and management of the Terminal was concerned; and
 - (c) regarding the definition of "cruise ship" as set out in clause 2 of the Bill, whether "any other vessel approved by the Commissioner for the purpose of this Ordinance" could be deleted or amended so as not to include non-cruise vessel as "cruise ship".

		(b) the inclusion of "any other vessel approved by the Commissioner for the purposes of this Ordinance" was necessary to cater for some non-cruise events. For example, Logos Hope, a floating library berthed at KTCT in April 2014, and the christening cum cocktail reception of a new container vessel held at KTCT in November 2013.	
		The Administration advised that it would provide a written response to ALA9's suggestion about adding a provision in the Bill, e.g. in clause 5, to empower the Commissioner to approve "any other vessels for the purposes of this Ordinance".

		The Administration advised that the access by any person or class of persons to the Terminal Area, or any part of it could be prohibited by the Commissioner or an authorized officer as defined in clause 2. The offence arising from contravention of clauses 7(1) or (2) would be a summary offence subject to a fine at level 1 (up to \$2,000). In reply to the Chairman's further enquiry, the Administration confirmed that the Bill was in conformity with the Basic Law, including the provisions concerning human rights.
