Motion to adjourn further proceedings of the Committee

The Committee continued with the debate on Mr Albert CHAN's motion to adjourn further proceedings of the Committee. At the invitation of the Chairman, Mr Albert CHAN introduced his motion.

- 2. <u>Mr LEUNG Kwok-hung</u>, <u>Mr Alan LEONG</u>, <u>Mr Gary FAN</u>, <u>Ms Emily LAU</u>, <u>Mr IP Kin-yuen</u>, <u>Mr LEE Cheuk-yan</u>, <u>Mr WU Chi-wai</u>, <u>Dr Fernando CHEUNG</u>, <u>Mr WONG Yuk-man</u>, <u>Ms Cyd HO</u>, <u>Mr Frederick FUNG</u> and <u>Mr CHAN Chi-chuen</u> spoke in support of the motion.
- 3. In gist, these members criticized the Administration for withdrawing important funding items to make way for early approval of the two funding

items related to the establishment of the Innovation and Technology Bureau ("ITB"). Some members commented that the Administration had not sufficiently elucidated the justifications and the scope of work of the proposed ITB, while some other members criticized the Administration for lack of vision and planning on the long-term development of technology industries in Hong Kong. Some members also criticized the Administration for establishing ITB just to accommodate the Chief Executive's political cronies. One member commented that the Innovation and Technology Commission was ineffective in promoting commercialization of research and development results, the development of which was funded under the Innovation and Technology Fund. He considered that it was unlikely that the proposed ITB would be able to make significant improvement in this regard.

- 4. <u>Mr YIU Si-wing</u>, <u>Ms Starry LEE</u>, <u>Mr IP Kwok-him</u>, <u>Mr CHAN Han-pan</u>, <u>Mr WONG Ting-kwong</u>, <u>Dr LO Wai-kwok</u>, <u>Mr CHAN Hak-kan</u>, <u>Mr Jeffrey LAM</u>, <u>Dr LAM Tai-fai</u>, <u>Mrs Regina IP</u>, <u>Dr CHIANG Lai-wan</u>, <u>Mr Charles MOK</u>, <u>Mr WONG Kwok-hing</u>, <u>Mr CHAN Kam-lam</u>, <u>Mr LEUNG Chi-cheung</u>, <u>Mr Steven HO</u> and <u>Mr TAM Yiu-chung</u> spoke against the motion.
- 5. These members mainly criticized members of the pan-democrat camp for procrastinating the funding process and stalling the development of technology industries and promotion of innovation in Hong Kong. They appealed to those members to drop their filibustering tactics and to approve the proposals expeditiously.
- 6. <u>Mr SIN Chung-kai</u> spoke in response to some members' comments on his position on the matter.
- 7. While Mr TAM Yiu-chung was speaking, Mr LEUNG Kwok-hung spoke loudly in his seat. The Chairman told Mr LEUNG to remain silent when it was not his turn to speak. Mr Frederick FUNG interrupted Mr TAM's speech and tried to clarify a comment of Mr TAM about him. The Chairman said that Mr Frederick FUNG should respond to Mr TAM's comments when it was his turn to speak during the debate on the agenda items.
- 8. The Administration did not have comments in response to the motion.
- 9. At the invitation of the Chairman, <u>Mr Albert CHAN</u> delivered his concluding remarks. During Mr CHAN's speech, Mr TAM Yiu-chung interrupted and said that some of Mr CHAN's remarks were offensive, and requested the Chairman to order Mr CHAN to retract his comments. In response to the Chairman, Mr CHAN said that some members of the

pro-establishment camp had used similar language to criticize Mr Alan LEONG, but the Chairman had not ruled such remarks as offensive. The Chairman said that Mr Alan LEONG had not raised a point of order and asked for his ruling against such remarks. He suspended the meeting at 12:21 pm to consider the point of order raised by Mr TAM Yiu-chung about Mr Albert CHAN's remarks.

- 10. The meeting resumed at 12:28 pm. The Chairman said that he had reviewed the video recording of the meeting. He considered that members from either camp had been sharp and critical at times in their comments about members of the opposite camp. He reminded members to show mutual respect and avoid personal attack in their speeches. Mr Albert CHAN then continued his concluding speech.
- 11. <u>The Chairman</u> then put Mr Albert CHAN's motion to vote. At the request of members, <u>the Chairman</u> ordered a division and the division bell was rung for five minutes.
- 12. <u>The Chairman</u> announced that 19 members voted for and 33 members voted against the motion. The votes of individual members were as follows –

- 13. <u>The Chairman</u> declared that the motion was negatived.
- 14. The Committee resumed the deliberation on the items FCR(2014-15)36 and FCR(2014-15)37.
- 15. Mr IP Kin-yuen said that Mr Charles MOK had made an effort to lobby him to support the proposed establishment of ITB. He commented that because of the Administration's withdrawal of the relevant funding proposals to make way for priority handling of the items related to the establishment of ITB, the implementation of the Enriched IT Programme in Secondary Schools and the Fourth Strategy on Information Technology in Education suffered delay and many schools would be affected.
- 16. <u>The Chairman</u> declared that the meeting be adjourned and the deliberation on the agenda items would continue at the next meeting after a break of 30 minutes.
- 17. The meeting was adjourned at 12:39 pm.
