Layout-design (Topography) of Integrated Circuits (Designation of Qualifying Countries, Territories or Areas) (Amendment) Regulation 2015 (L.N. 124)

L.N. 121 to L.N. 124 amend the respective Schedules to the Patents Ordinance (Cap. 514), the Registered Designs Ordinance (Cap. 522), the Trade Marks Ordinance (Cap. 559) and the Layout-design (Topography) of Integrated Circuits (Designation of Qualifying Countries, Territories or Areas) Regulation (Cap. 445B) to update the list of contracting parties to the Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property<sup>1</sup> (Paris Convention) and the membership list of the World Trade Organization<sup>2</sup> (WTO) as set out in these Schedules.

## . L.N. 121 to L.N. 124 seek to -

- (a) add "The State of Kuwait" to the list of countries that have acceded to the Paris Convention (L.N. 121 to L.N. 123);
- (b) add "The Republic of Yemen" to the list of WTO member countries, territories and areas (L.N. 123 and L.N. 124);
- (c) replace the reference to "The Republic of Cape Verde" by that of "The Republic of Cabo Verde" (L.N. 121 to L.N. 124) on the list of WTO members; and
- (d) make a textual amendment to a Chinese heading in the Schedule to achieve consistency with the English heading  $(L.N. 122)^3$ .

3. In compliance with the Paris Convention, as extended by the Central People's Government (CPG) to the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR), and the Agreement on Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights (TRIPS Agreement) under the WTO, of which HKSAR is a member in its own right, HKSAR has enacted specific provisions in Cap. 514, Cap. 522 and Cap.  $559^4$  to the effect that a person who has filed an application in or for a Paris Convention country or WTO member country, territory or area on the corresponding list in the respective Schedules to these ordinances will enjoy a right of priority in respect of the same invention, design or trade mark when filing the application in HKSAR during a prescribed period. To comply with the TRIPS Agreement, provisions have been made in the Layout-design (Topography) of Integrated Circuits Ordinance (Cap. 445)<sup>5</sup> to the effect that the same level of intellectual property protection for layout-designs (topographies) of integrated circuits is to be granted to nationals of other WTO members, as to HKSAR residents. Cap. 445B sets out, in its Schedule, a list of WTO members as qualifying countries, territories or areas for such protection.

4. According to paragraph 6 of the LegCo Brief, since the last annual revision in 2014 (L.N. 68 to L.N. 71 of 2014), one more country (i.e. The State of Kuwait) has become a contracting party to the Paris Convention and another

Section 24(2) provides that the Chief Executive may by a regulation designate a country, territory or area as a qualifying country, territory or area.

(i.e. The Republic of Yemen) has acceded to the WTO Agreement. In addition, the official English name of one WTO member (i.e. The Republic of Cape Verde) has to be updated with reference to the United Nations Multilingual Terminology Database with a view to achieving consistency in terminology. According to paragraph 8 of the LegCo Brief, as the application of the Paris Convention was extended to HKSAR by CPG, the Administration has sought the prior agreement of CPG via the Office of the Commissioner of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the People's Republic of China in HKSAR before the amendments relating to the list of Paris Convention countries in the relevant Schedules to Cap. 514, Cap. 522 and Cap. 559 are made.

5. Members may refer to the LegCo Brief (File Ref.: CITB 80/18/2) issued by the Commerce and Economic Development Bureau on 9 June 2015 for other background information.

6. L.N. 121 to L.N. 124 come into operation on 27 November 2015.

7. The Clerk to the Panel on Commerce and Industry has advised that the information paper provided by the Administration on the four pieces of subsidiary legislation has been circulated to members of the Panel on Commerce and Industry vide LC Paper No. CB(1)509/14-15 issued on 4 February 2015. Panel members noted at the meeting held on 10 February 2015 that the proposed amendments to the relevant schedules reflect the updated list of contracting parties to the Paris Convention and membership position of the WTO.

8. The amendments are technical in nature. No difficulties have been identified in the legal and drafting aspects of the above items of subsidiary legislation.
