Proposed timing for discussion

1. PWP Item No. 5054DP – Further enhancing the quality of coastal waters of Victoria Harbour

November 2014

As announced in the 2014 Policy Address, the Environmental Protection Department will commission a consultancy study with the long-term objective of enhancing the leisure and amenity value of the coastal areas of Victoria Harbour. An engagement exercise involving academics, green groups, professional bodies, nine District Councils, Advisory Council on the Environment and Harbourfront Commission was carried out between March and August 2014. The Administration will brief the Panel on the progress.

Members have indicated their wish to follow up the motion on "Comprehensively improving the water quality of the Victoria Harbour", which was passed at the Legislative Council meeting on 16 November 2011.

The subject was raised by Dr Helena WONG at the meeting on 10 October 2013. Members are concerned about the odour and poor quality of the water at the sewage outlets along the waterfront and wish to be briefed on Hong Kong's sewage management and maintenance of drainage (including illegal drainage connections).

2. Emergency sewage discharge incident at Pillar Point Sewage Treatment Works, Tuen Mun on 25 and 26 August 2014

November 2014

The Administration will brief members on the investigation of the incident conducted by the Drainage Services Department's Task Force and the improvement measures on the communication and coordination among the concerned government departments and the publicity arrangements in handling similar emergency incidents.

Proposed timing for discussion

3. Banning of commercial fishing in marine parks

Referral on banning of fishing in Geopark arising from the meeting between Legislative Council Members and Tai Po District Council members on 3 June 2010 (LC Paper No. CB(1)2817/09-10). Submission from the Friends of Hoi Ha on the subject (LC Paper No. CB(1)799/12-13(01) issued on 3 April 2013).

The Administration will brief members on the progress of policy initiatives to ban commercial fishing in marine parks.

4. Nature conservation policy

The Administration proposes to brief the Panel on the public consultation/engagement on the Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan.
