Proposed timing for discussion

1. Progress of air quality improvement measures

April 2015

The Administration will report to the Panel on the progress of the implementation of air quality improvement measures including the first annual report on the progress of phasing out pre-Euro IV diesel commercial vehicles.

Members would also like to be briefed on the application of the new "Pollutants in the Atmosphere and their Transport over Hong Kong" ("PATH") model for air quality assessment in Hong Kong.

2. Producer Responsibility Scheme on Glass Beverage Bottles

The subject was raised by Dr Kenneth CHAN at the meeting on 16 October 2012. Members would like to be briefed on the latest development on the nature conservation policy, including the protection of incense trees, the prohibition of illegal ivory trade and the establishment of marine parks.
