Control on marine pollution from oil spillage, marine littering and floating refuse</p> <p>Pursuant to the discussion on "Controlling the impact of dumping and dredging activities on the marine environment" at the Panel meeting on 14 June 2013, the Administration proposes to brief the Panel on the legislative control on marine pollution arising from oil spillage, marine littering, and floating refuse. 4. Nature conservation policy
