#### **Post-secondary education**

1. Admission University Grants **Committee** to ("UGC")-funded institutions through the Joint University Programmes Admission System ("JUPAS") to non-JUPAS and **UGC-funded** routes post-graduate programmes

Item proposed by Hon IP Kin-yuen, Hon Gary FAN and Dr Hon Helena WONG. At its meeting on 10 February 2014, the Panel had discussed issues relating to admission of students under non-JUPAS and of non-local students to publicly-funded postgraduate programmes.

2. Policy on funding support provided to post-secondary institutions by the University Grants Committee ("UGC") and the Research Grants Council

Dr Hon Helena WONG proposed that the Panel should arrange a meeting to receive views from deputations. At the meeting held on 8 December 2014, the Administration had briefed the Panel on various types of funding support made available by the Government for research work conducted by the post-secondary education sector.

3. Policy on the provision of publicly-funded associate degree programmes

Dr Hon Kenneth CHAN was concerned about the discontinuation of certain Higher Diploma programmes confirmed offered by Hong Kong Polytechnic University.

4. Issues related to the provision of programme places by publicly-funded post-secondary institutions, the level of tuition fees, and the composition of their governing bodies

Item proposed by Hon IP Kin-yuen and Dr Hon Kenneth CHAN. Issues related to the provision of programme places by publicly-funded post-secondary institutions and the level of tuition fees had been discussed on 12 January 2015 when the Panel discussed the subjects on the progress on various initiatives to broaden the opportunities for local students to receive subsidized higher education and the recurrent funding for University Grants Committee-funded institutions in the 2015/16 roll-over year.

7. Review of the New Senior Secondary Curriculum and Assessment and related issues (including concerns arising from Chinese History and Liberal Studies subjects)

December 2014, the Administration had briefed the Panel on the analysis of the patterns and trends of the registration for the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination of various subjects with reference to the Hong Kong Certificate of Education Examination and Hong Kong Advanced Level Examination in the past.

## 8. Decline in secondary student population and related issues, including small class teaching and class-to-teacher ratio in secondary schools

Item proposed by Hon IP Kin-yuen and Hon Abraham SHEK. The subject on Measures to address issues arising from the drop in secondary student population was last discussed on 18 March 2014. Issues related to the class-to-teacher ratio and teacher-to-student ratio had been discussed on 10 and 22 June 2013, while issues related to small class teaching had been discussed at several meetings including those held on 2 and 3 November 2012 and 17 April 2013.

### 11. Review on the implementation of Territory-wide System Assessment

Item proposed by Hon IP Kin-yuen. The subject was last discussed on 13 January 2014. Members had also expressed their concerns on this subject when Hon Michael TIEN's motion on "Returning a happy childhood to students" was debated at the Council meeting of 5 November 2014.
