# Implementation of the Mandatory Provident Fund System Progress Report – May 2015

### **Purpose**

This paper is a monthly update on the implementation of the Mandatory Provident Fund (MPF) System.

#### **Enrolment**

2. The estimated enrolment statistics are as follows:

3. As at end May 2015, 20 800 employers, 498 500 employees and 16 400 SEPs were registered under the Industry Schemes.

### **Complaint Handling**

Complaints received by the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Authority (MPFA) on system operation

4. In May 2015, 392 complaints were received by MPFA, of which 360 complaints were made against 255 employers. A breakdown of these complaints by allegation is as follows:

# Complaints received by the Labour Department (LD)

- 5. In May 2015, the LD received 13 MPF-related complaints, all of which were related to alleged wrongful deduction of wages and default contribution.
- 6. Of the 62 complaints received from 1 January 2015 to 31 May 2015:
  - (a) 16 cases were resolved after conciliation or advice given;
  - (b) 16 cases were referred to the Labour Tribunal/Minor Employment Claims Adjudication Board for adjudication;
  - (c) 3 cases where the employers were insolvent were referred to the Legal Aid Department and the Protection of Wages on Insolvency Fund; and
  - (d) 27 cases where the employees had lodged claims with the LD were awaiting conciliation result.

#### **Enforcement**

- 7. The MPFA continued to enforce the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Ordinance by investigating complaints, inspecting employment premises, making claims at law courts on behalf of employees to recover outstanding default contributions, and prosecuting non-compliant employers.
- 8. Enforcement actions taken by MPFA in May 2015 are summarized below:

### **Education and Publicity**

- 9. Terminal illness will be a ground for the early withdrawal of MPF benefits starting from 1 August 2015, under the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes (Amendment) Ordinance 2015 (Commencement) Notice 2015 ("Commencement Notice") gazetted on 15 May. The Commencement Notice was tabled in the Legislative Council for negative vetting on 20 May 2015. The MPFA will announce implementation details of the new arrangements upon the passage of the Commencement Notice.
- 10. To further enhance scheme members' understanding of key fundamental MPF investment concepts and encourage them to take good care of their MPF investment, a series of eight videos of "MPFA TV" (積金台) were arranged to telecast on out-of-home and online media from May to June. Print advertisements on two magazines were also arranged to reach a wide audience.
- 11. In May, a school-based parenting workshop for kindergarten kids and their parents, a seminar for parents of primary school students, as well as on-campus life-planning workshops for senior form secondary school students were organized to educate students and their parents on the proper attitudes towards money management and the basic concepts of MPF. Meanwhile, information on the MPF System and MPF investment was distributed to some 43 000 graduates of tertiary institutions.
- During the month, 12 seminars on MPF were given to employers, employees and civil servants to educate them on the features of the MPF System and MPF investment. MPFA also participated in a career fair to disseminate MPF messages and provide on-site personal account checking service to job seekers and members of the public.
