Question:

It is stated in Reply Serial No. LC043 that the total number of overtime hours worked by the Secretariat staff in the 2014-15 legislative session was about 16 299 hours, reflecting that the situation was serious. In this connection:

- 1. How do the authorities handle the overtime ("OT") hours worked by the staff currently? What are the additional expenses involved? For those OT hours that were worked by staff, has the Secretariat made compensation by way of money, or has it allowed the staff concerned to take time-off in lieu ("TOIL")? What are the proportions and numbers of OT hours compensated by money and by TOIL respectively?
- 2. Have the authorities studied the reasons for staff working overtime and proposed solutions to address the issue?

### Reply:

Overtime ("OT") work undertaken by Secretariat staff should normally be compensated by time-off in lieu ("TOIL"). Where the granting of TOIL is impracticable within a specified timeframe, overtime allowance ("OTA") may be paid to eligible staff. In respect of the 16 299 OT hours worked by Secretariat staff directly or indirectly involved in servicing meetings of the Council and its committees in the 2014-15 legislative session, about 90% of OT hours were compensated by TOIL, and the remaining 10% OT hours by OTA (approximately \$279,000 was paid as OTA).

2. Longer duration of meetings of the Council and its committees, as well as the increasing complexity of business of the Council and its committees are the main reasons for the need to work overtime. The Secretariat will keep in view the manpower situation and continue to explore ways to relieve the workload of staff through, for instance, streamlining the work procedures by information technology automation.

As at 1 April in 2013, 2014 and 2015, 409, 455 and 472 staff respectively in various Divisions of the Legislative Council Secretariat were involved in servicing Council and committee meetings. Details of these staff by functional areas are as follows:
