Subcommittee on Public Health and Municipal Services (Fees and Charges) (Museums) (Amendment) Regulation 2016

Background brief prepared by the Legislative Council Secretariat

Purpose

This paper provides background information on the Public Health and Municipal Services (Fees and Charges) (Museums) (Amendment) Regulation 2016 ("the Amendment Regulation") (L.N. 84), and gives a brief account of previous discussion of the Panel on Home Affairs ("the Panel") on the subject.

Background

2. According to the Administration, the month-long free admission to the Leisure and Cultural Services Department ("LCSD") museums¹ launched in January 2016 under the "Appreciate Hong Kong" Campaign was well received by the public. To further promote the appreciation of art, culture, history and science, as well as to widen the audience base, the Chief Executive announced in his 2016 Policy Address that the Government would make free admission to permanent exhibitions of designated museums of LCSD a standing practice.

3. Under the new initiative, the following changes will be made to the existing arrangements for the seven fee-charging designated museums :

- (a) all visitors should be allowed free admission to permanent exhibitions of five fee-charging designated museums, i.e., HKMA, Hong Kong Heritage Museum, Hong Kong Museum of History, Hong Kong Museum of Coastal Defence and Dr Sun Yat-sen Museum;
- (b) full-time students should be allowed free admission to permanent exhibitions of the Hong Kong Science Museum ("HKScM") and HKSpM (except the Space Theatre of HKSpM), with a view to

enhancing the promotion of science and astronomical knowledge among students;

- (c) to complement the arrangement in paragraph 3(b), the fees for admission to the permanent exhibitions of HKScM by visitors other than full-time students should be reduced by 20%;
- (d) the charges of annual museum passes should be reduced by 50%, because visitors would enjoy free admission (or admission at reduced fees) to permanent exhibitions of the fee-charging museums under the new initiative. All other museum passes (i.e., half-yearly, monthly and weekly passes) should be abolished in anticipation of significantly lower demand after the implementation of free admission; and
- (e) the existing free admission arrangement for all visitors on Wednesdays and International Museum Day, Hong Kong², should be formalized.

4. The arrangements and fee levels for admission to permanent exhibitions of LCSD museums and museum passes before and after the implementation of the free admission initiative are set out in the **Appendix**.

The Amendment Regulation (L.N. 84)

5. The Amendment Regulation is made by the Secretary for Home Affairs under section 124J(1) of the Public Health and Municipal Services Ordinance (Cap. 132) to amend the Public Health and Municipal Services (Fees and Charges) (Museums) Regulation (Cap. 132CK) in order to give effect to the changes in paragraph 3 above. The Amendment Regulation will come into operation on 1 August 2016.

Consultation with the Panel

6. At its meeting on 17 May 2016, the Panel was consulted on the proposed arrangements and fee levels for admission to the permanent exhibitions of LCSD museums and museum passes after the implementation of the free admission initiative. The major concerns expressed by members are summarized below.

7. While members in general expressed support for the new arrangements, some members enquired whether it was possible to offer free admission to the

permanent exhibitions of HKScM and HKSpM to the public as well instead of The Administration explained that given the larger only full-time students. number of interactive exhibits in HKScM and HKSpM and in light of the increased damage rate of interactive exhibits in HKScM during the free admission period under the "Appreciate Hong Kong" Campaign, the Administration had to pay heed to their capacity constraints in determining the number of visitors the museums could accommodate under the new initiative, in order to keep the interactive exhibits in good condition and ensure a safe and pleasant visit for the visitors. The Administration advised that the proposal was made taking into consideration the capacity constraints of HKScM and HKSpM, and the policy objective of enhancing the promotion of science and astronomical knowledge among students. Nevertheless, the current concessionary half-fare admission would continue to be offered to senior citizens aged 60 or above as well as persons with disabilities ("PWDs") and one accompanying carer of each The existing mechanism for fee-waiver applications would remain valid PWD. for schools, charitable and non-profit making organizations. The arrangement for free museum admission on Wednesdays and International Museum Day, Hong Kong, would also be maintained.

8. Some members expressed concern about the measures to be taken to help control the visitors' flow in anticipation of a large increase in the number of visitors to the permanent exhibitions of the designated museums under the new arrangements. The Administration assured members that appropriate measures would be taken when necessary to step up control of visitors' flow at the designated museums. Additional funding had also been allocated to LCSD in 2016-2017 to cover costs for additional service requirements on security guards, cleansing, technical and maintenance services in anticipation of an increase in attendance and breakdown rate of exhibits upon implementation of the new initiative.
