The officers at the meeting said for the later housing benefit offered to the local civil servant, such as the Home Purchase Scheme or Home Finance Scheme after 1980, the Old Housing Scheme Member can have a choice to surrender back the Housing Scheme to the Coopt Societies and changed to the new benefit scheme. Even one wished to shift, the enjoyment period of the house allowance was only few years. How could one afford to pay for the balance of loan for the new property after the retirement.
