As a member of the public, I hereby

the revision of current disability allowances.

The screening process of disability allowance
may show the indifference of core needs of a
disabled person; "the ability of labour" is a criteria
of unlimited ambiguity, where the line between
"able to work" and "unable to work" is too
blurred to have a person qualify for his ~~re~~
benefits.

There is no known jurisdictions using a
"simple, straight-forward" criteria to test the
qualification of disability. The loss of function, whether
visible or invisible, is the main point for the disability.
The loss of physical function itself, — or anything



vital to the life— could build a barrier to one's social life. The ability to work, however, is all upon the physicians' decision. In such the accessible society, every disabled person who ~~have~~ has certain impairment could engage into the labour, given the support and aids are positively settled for ~~to~~ him. If this is the case, he could fail to qualify for the disability benefits, and excluded from participation in the society.

Moreover, the percentages classification seems less appropriate for defining disability. Hong Kong is the only country I found for using this; instead, many developed countries use the "level system" for the classification of one's degree of disability. In ~~the~~ addition, all degrees of ~~disag~~ disability shall deserve the social benefits from the state, whether this

degree would prevent him from "~~the~~ engaging" in the labour".

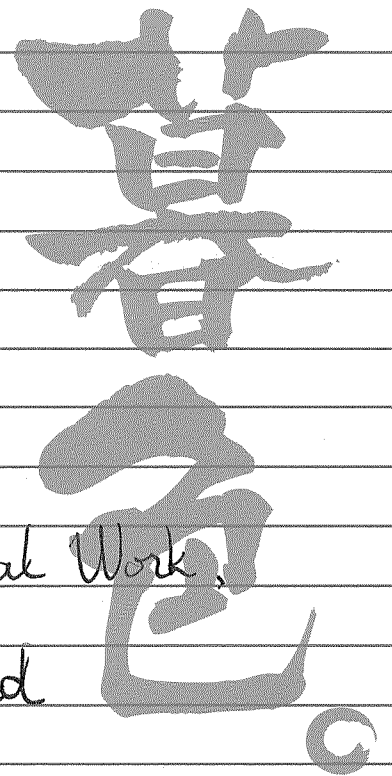
