Discussion

<u>The Subcommittee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings attached at the **Annex**).

Follow-up actions to be taken by the Administration

Proposed amendments

- Admin
- 2. The Administration pointed out that vehicle suppliers had already confirmed adequate supply of Euro VI diesel commercial vehicles on the local market by the proposed commencement date of the Euro VI emission standards and the vehicle repair trade could have access to the maintenance information for Euro VI vehicles. However, in consideration of members' strong request for deferring the commencement date to address the transport trades' concerns over the supply of compliant vehicles and competent vehicle mechanics for repairing Euro VI diesel vehicles, the Administration would propose amendments to the Air Pollution Control (Vehicle Design Standards) (Emission) (Amendment) Regulation 2017 ("Amendment Regulation") to the effect of:
 - (a) deferring the commencement date of the Euro VI emission standards for newly registered heavy duty vehicles with design weight more than 3.5 tonnes (except bus with design weight not more than 9 tonnes and light bus with design weight more than 3.5 tonnes) from 1 January 2018 to 1 October 2018; and
 - (b) deferring the commencement date of the California LEV III emission standards for newly registered diesel private cars from 1 July 2017 to 1 October 2017.

<u>Members</u> raised no objection in principle to the Administration's proposed amendments. <u>The Administration</u> would provide the draft amendments to the Subcommittee for consideration.

(*Post-meeting note*: Having studied the Administration's proposed amendments, the Legal Adviser to the Subcommittee confirmed that no difficulties had been identified in relation to the legal and drafting aspects of the draft amendments. The draft amendments were circulated to members on 22 March 2017 vide LC Paper No. CB(1)719/16-17(01). By the deadline of 5:00 pm on 22 March 2017, the Secretariat had not received any views from members on the draft amendments. The Administration wrote to the Subcommittee on 27 March 2017 explaining the reasons for giving notice to move its proposed motion at the earlier

Council meeting of 29 March 2017, instead of following the normal practice to move the motion at the meeting of 12 April 2017 (i.e. the last Council meeting for amending the subsidiary legislation under the extended scrutiny period). The letter was circulated to Members vide LC Paper No. CB(1)741/16-17 on 27 March 2017. The motion moved by the Administration to amend the Amendment Regulation was passed at the Council meeting of 29 March 2017.)

Tackling excessive emissions from diesel private cars fitted with defeat device to circumvent emission testing

Admin 3. <u>The Administration</u> was requested to provide information on the remedial actions taken/to be taken to tackle the excessive emissions of diesel private cars imported into/registered in Hong Kong that were fitted with defeat device to circumvent emission testing in the laboratory.

(*Post-meeting note*: The Administration's written response was issued on 28 March 2017 vide LC Paper No. CB(1)745/16-17(01)).

Legislative timetable

4. The Chairman advised that he would move a motion at the Council meeting of 22 March 2017 to extend the scrutiny period of the Amendment Regulation to the Council meeting of 12 April 2017. If the scrutiny period was extended, the deadline for giving notice of motion to amend the Amendment Regulation was 5 April 2017. The Chairman would give a verbal report of the deliberations of the Subcommittee to the House Committee on 24 March 2017.

(*Post-meeting note*: The motion moved by the Chairman to extend the scrutiny period of the Amendment Regulation was passed at the Council meeting of 22 March 2017.)

- 5. The Chairman concluded that subject to the Administration providing the draft amendments and further information referred to in paragraphs 2 and 3 above, the Subcommittee had completed scrutiny of the provisions of the Amendment Regulation, and would not propose any amendments in its name.
