Proposed timing for discussion

1. Implementation arrangements for municipal solid waste charging

27 March 2017

The Administration will consult members on the implementation arrangements for municipal solid waste charging.

The Administration plans to introduce the relevant legislative proposal into the Legislative Council in mid-2017.

The Public Accounts Committee issued a referral memorandum dated 16 February 2017 recommending the Panel to follow up on issues relating to the post-implementation review of the implementation of the Policy Framework for the Management of Municipal Solid Waste (2005-2014).

2. Progress of Government's efforts on nature conservation and marine conservation and legislative proposal to phase out the local trade in ivory

27 March 2017

The Administration will brief and consult members on the following:

- (a) the Government's efforts on nature conservation and marine conservation; and
- (b) the legislative proposal to phase out the local trade in ivory.

The Administration plans to introduce the relevant legislative proposal into the Legislative Council in June 2017.

Dr Elizabeth QUAT wrote to the Panel Chairman on 20 October 2016 (LC Paper No. CB(1)30/16-17(01) issued on 20 October 2016) proposing discussion on issues relating to the enactment of legislation for an ivory trade ban, establishment of a nature conservation trust, and penalties for illegal trading of wildlife.

Referral on banning of fishing in Geopark arising from the meeting between Legislative Council Members and Tai Po District Council members on 3 June 2010 (LC Paper No. CB(1)2817/09-10). Submission from the Friends of Hoi Ha on the subject (LC Paper No. CB(1)799/12-13(01) issued on 3 April 2013).

Pursuant to the discussion at the Panel meeting on 25 June 2014 on the subject of "Impact of construction works on important species, marine ecology and the fisheries industry", members wish to follow up the cumulative impacts of the planned marine works projects in the western waters of Hong Kong (as mentioned in LC Paper No. CB(1)2004/13-14(01)) on marine ecology as well as the progress of respective mitigation measures and restoration works.

Dr Kenneth CHAN wrote to the Panel Chairman on 10 February 2015 (LC Paper No. CB(1)540/14-15(01)) proposing discussion on the impacts of large-scale infrastructure projects and sea transport on marine ecology.

As it was reported by the media that a contractor of the construction works of the Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge ("HKZMB") project had illegally discharged polluting effluent directly into the sea, causing adverse impacts on the habitat of Chinese white dolphins, at the meeting of 15 October 2015, Mr Albert CHAN requested the Administration to give a full account of the incident and update Panel members on the impacts of the marine works projects, including the HKZMB project and the Three-Runway System project at the Hong Kong International Airport, on marine ecology.

3. Improvement of roadside air quality

Mr Charles Peter MOK wrote to the Panel Chairman on 28 October 2016 (LC Paper No. CB(1)54/16-17(01) issued on 1 November 2016) proposing discussion on the policy and ancillary facilities in support of the use of electric vehicles, and designation of pedestrian zone in Central.

1st quarter or 2nd quarter of 2017

4. Enhanced work plan on combating climate change

 1^{st} quarter or 2^{nd} quarter of 2017

Dr Elizabeth QUAT wrote to the Panel Chairman on 20 October 2016 (LC Paper No. CB(1)30/16-17(01) issued on 20 October 2016) proposing discussion on combating climate change, and promoting energy saving and reducing emissions.

Dr Elizabeth QUAT also proposed discussion on issues relating to the adoption of a sponge city design, and development of urban forest. As advised by the Administration, these issues should be under the purview of the Development Bureau. Members may exchange views with the Administration on these issues under "Enhanced work plan on combating climate change".

5. Promotion of energy conservation and renewable energy

2nd quarter of 2017

Mr Kenneth LEUNG wrote to the Panel Chairman on 28 October 2016 (LC Paper No. CB(1)54/16-17(02) issued on 1 November 2016) proposing discussion on issues relating to enhancing Hong Kong's energy self-sufficiency, energy conservation, energy efficiency and development of renewable energy produced locally.

6. Update on the progress of preparation for implementing Producer Responsibility Scheme on Glass Beverage Containers

2nd quarter of 2017 (tentative)

The Administration plans to consult the Panel on the legislative proposal in the second quarter of 2017.

7. Tackling marine refuse problem

2nd quarter or 3rd quarter of 2017

Dr Elizabeth QUAT wrote to the Panel Chairman on 20 October 2016 (LC Paper No. CB(1)30/16-17(01) issued on 20 October 2016) proposing discussion on issues relating to marine littering, and the problem of dumping of plastic waste in particular.

8. Deteriorating water quality of the Shing Mun River and Tolo Harbour

2nd quarter or 3rd quarter of 2017 (tentative)

Mr Steven HO wrote to the Panel Chairman on 30 March 2016 (LC Paper No. CB(1)735/15-16(02) issued on 31 March 2016) proposing discussion on the captioned subject.

Dr Elizabeth QUAT wrote to the Panel Chairman on 20 October 2016 (LC Paper No. CB(1)30/16-17(01) issued on 20 October 2016) proposing discussion on the water quality of Shing Mun River.

9. Management of marine fill and marine disposal of dredged/excavated sediment

4th quarter of 2017 (tentative)

The Administration will brief the Panel on the management of marine fill and disposal of dredged/excavated sediments by the project owners.

The subject was raised by Mr Steven HO at the meeting on 15 December 2014.

At the meeting on 28 November 2016, Mr LEUNG Yiu-chung suggested the Panel to discuss the environmental issues relating to illegal disposal of construction and demolition materials into the sea/river. The Administration advised that these issues could be discussed under this item.

10. Control of indoor air quality

4th quarter of 2017 (tentative)

The item was proposed by Dr Helena WONG at the meeting of 18 October 2016. Members would like to discuss issues relating to the control of indoor air quality, including setting indoor air quality objectives, and establishing standards for hazardous emissions from household furniture.

11. Improving the water quality of Victoria Harbour

4th quarter of 2017 (tentative)

Dr Priscilla LEUNG wrote to the Panel Chairman on 19 October 2016 (LC Paper No. CB(1)24/16-17(01) issued on 20 October 2016) proposing discussion on the captioned subject.

As agreed at the meeting on 28 November 2016, the Administration was requested to provide a further written response, if appropriate, on this item.

14. Development of an artificial bathing beach at Lung Mei in Tai Po
