I am writing to you today as a lead organizer for the Global March for Elephants – State of Michigan. Since the inception of the Marches that began in 2013, I have received over 10,000 signatures from residents of the State of Michigan on a petition that supports a complete ban on the sale of ivory products. 99% of the people I talk to on a daily basis will agree that ivory is not a necessity for anyone except for the glorious, sentient creature that had the misfortune of being born with it...
