Re: Bank of Communications (Hong Kong) (Merger) Bill

I refer to your letter dated 18 January 2017 and would like to advise as follows:

Whether public consultation is required in respect of bills (1)introduced by Members under the existing law or Rules of Procedure

Article 74 of the Basic Law provides that Members of the Legislative Council (LegCo) may introduce bills into LegCo in accordance with the provisions of the Basic Law and legal procedures (including the Rules of Procedure). Under the existing law and the Rules of Procedure, there is no requirement of inviting public views in respect of the bills introduced by Members. As a matter of practice, however, the relevant Bills Committee (if formed) would decide whether public views should be invited. Please refer to paragraph 2.3 of the Handbook for Chairmen of Bills Committees (http://www.legco.gov.hk/general/english/procedur As you know, when the Bank of /bc handbook.htm). Communications (Hong Kong) Limited (Merger) Bill ("the Former Bill") was introduced into the Fifth LegCo, a Bills Committee was

then formed to study the Former Bill. The relevant Bills Committee had not invited public views on the Former Bill.

(2) Examples of Member's bills on which public views were invited

Since 1997, a number of Member's bills were passed by LegCo. Among those bills on which a Bills Committee was formed, there were cases where the Bills Committee concerned had decided to invite public views taking into consideration the nature of the bills and their possible implications on stakeholders, etc. Examples of these cases are set out at **Annex** for your reference.
