(b) Detection rate of offences committed by visitors

Detection rate refers to the percentage of cases successfully detected by the Police with the suspects being arrested. The rate is calculated based on the number of cases rather than the suspects arrested. Given that the Police cannot ascertain whether a suspect is a visitor before case detection, it is not possible to calculate the detection rate of crimes committed by visitors.
