- 1. Co-location arrangement at the control point for the Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link ("XRL")** To be advised by THB

Item proposed by Hon Dennis KWOK, whose letter on the subject had been circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)707/12-13 on 27 February 2013. At the meeting on 1 March 2013, members agreed that the subject be discussed at a future meeting. Members also agreed that members of the Panel on Administration of Justice and Legal Services and representatives from the Department of Justice would be invited to attend when the subject was discussed.

The Administration advised that co-location arrangement at the control point concerned was part and parcel of the XRL project spearheaded by the Transport and Housing Bureau ("THB"), which would provide information to the Panel on Transport on the co-location arrangement of immigration and customs facilities at the control point as part and parcel of the XRL project in due course.

The subject of co-location arrangements at the control point for XRL was discussed at the meeting of the Subcommittee on Matters Relating to Railways on 14 December 2015.

At the meeting on 28 October 2016, Hon Claudia MO suggested that the item be arranged for discussion.
