## II. Matters arising

# Report by the Chairman on her meeting with the Chief Secretary for Administration

## Stamp Duty (Amendment) Bill 2017

2. The Chairman said that she had relayed to the Chief Secretary for Administration ("CS") the concerns raised by Mr James TO at the last House Committee ("HC") meeting regarding the Stamp Duty (Amendment) Bill 2017 ("the Bill"). CS had advised that the Administration planned to give notice of its intention to resume the proceedings on the Bill at a later time after the debate on the motion on the co-location arrangement for the Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link had been completed.

3. Mr James TO sought advice as to whether the Administration or Members could propose Committee stage amendments ("CSAs") to the Bill after the Administration gave notice of its intention to resume the relevant proceedings on the Bill. At the invitation of the Chairman, the Clerk said that the proceedings on the Committee stage of the Bill had already commenced at the Council meeting of 18 October 2017. As the Bill was not withdrawn by the Administration and the motion to adjourn the proceedings of the Committee of the whole Council on the Bill was passed during its Committee stage, both Members and the Administration could not move new CSAs to the Bill. The Chairman advised that such arrangement was in line with the established practice of the Legislative Council for processing bills and proposed CSAs.

## Report of HC on Consideration of Subsidiary Legislation

12. <u>The Chairman</u> invited Members to note the list tabled at the meeting (LC Paper No. CB(3)106/17-18), which contained four items of subsidiary legislation the period for amendment of which would expire at the Council meeting of 15 November 2017. She reminded Members to indicate their intention by 12:00 midnight on Tuesday, 7 November 2017, should they wish to speak on any of these items of subsidiary legislation.

### V. Reports of Bills Committees and subcommittees

# Report of the Subcommittee on Pharmacy and Poisons (Amendment) (No. 5) Regulation 2017

- 13. Mr CHAN Han-pan, Chairman of the Subcommittee, made a verbal report on the deliberations of the Subcommittee. Mr CHAN said that the Pharmacy and Poisons (Amendment) (No. 5) Regulation 2017 aimed to impose control on pharmaceutical products consisting of Netupitant and its salts so that they could be sold in the market upon fulfilment of the relevant statutory requirements.
- 14. Members noted that the Subcommittee held one meeting with the Administration on 31 October 2017. Members of the Subcommittee had expressed concerns about the enforcement measures on pharmaceutical products subject to similar control ("controlled pharmaceutical products"), including the handling of persons in possession of controlled pharmaceutical products for their personal use prescribed by non-locally registered medical practitioners, the regulation of internet sale of pharmaceutical products as well as the controlled registration requirements of pharmaceutical products. Members were advised that according to the Administration, the current legislation contained regulating provisions on the sale of pharmaceutical products, and details of the registration requirements were listed on the website of the Drug Office of the Department of Health.

- 15. <u>Members</u> also noted that the Subcommittee would not propose any amendment to the subsidiary legislation and would submit its written report in due course.
- 16. <u>The Chairman</u> reminded Members that as the period for amending the above subsidiary legislation would expire at the Council meeting of 15 November 2017, the deadline for giving notice of amendments, if any, would be Wednesday, 8 November 2017.

#### VI. Position on Bills Committees and subcommittees

(LC Paper No. CB(2)200/17-18)

17. <u>The Chairman</u> said that as at 2 November 2017, there were 16 Bills Committees, 20 subcommittees under HC and four subcommittees on policy issues under Panels in action. Ten subcommittees on policy issues were on the waiting list.
