1. Setting up a new contract residential care home for the elderly in the retail and welfare block of the public rental housing development at Hang Tai Road, Ma On Shan (Yan On Estate Extension)

The Social Welfare Department proposes to set up a new contract residential care home for the elderly ("RCHE") in the public rental housing development of the Hong Kong Housing Authority at Hang Tai Road, Ma On Shan (Yan On Estate Extension). Following the established arrangements, the capital cost for the project is to be funded by Lotteries Fund. As the proposed RCHE in the project is anticipated to give rise to an additional recurrent cost exceeding \$10 million per annum, the Panel shall be briefed on the project.

2. Community care support for persons suffering from dementia and their carers

Hon LUK Chung-hung has suggested that the Panel should discuss dedicated services for persons suffering from dementia.

Dr Hon Helena WONG has also suggested that community care support for these persons and their carers should be discussed.

3. Hong Kong Rehabilitation Programme Plan

Services for elderly

19. Review of Residential Care Homes (Elderly Persons) Ordinance (Cap. 459)

The Panel of the Fifth Legislative Council ("the former Panel") acceded to Prof Hon Joseph LEE's request for holding a joint meeting with the Panel on Health Services ("HS Panel") to discuss the Residential Care Homes (Elderly Persons) Ordinance (Cap. 459) with a view to improving the quality of these residential care homes ("RCHs").

20. Care services for elderly persons with special needs

The Subcommittee on Issues Relating to the Future Development of Elderly Services Schemes formed under the former Panel had studied, inter alia, the care services for elderly persons with special needs. The Subcommittee submitted its report (LC Paper No. CB(2)1902/15-16) to the former Panel in July 2016. In its report the Subcommittee suggested that the Panel should follow up the provision of services by the Administration for elderly persons with chronic diseases, dementia or disabilities as well as elderly persons from ethnic minorities and from sexual minorities.

21. Infirmary care in non-hospital setting

The Administration consulted the Panel of the Third Legislative Council in December 2004 on a proposal to launch a trial scheme to provide infirmary care places for medically stable elders in a non-hospital setting. Various options are being explored, including upgrading some of the places in subvented RCHs for the elderly to provide infirmary care. The Administration will report the progress in due course.

Social security

22. Review of Comprehensive Social Security Assistance

Dr Hon Fernando CHEUNG has suggested that the Panel should discuss and receive deputations' views on review of the Comprehensive Social Security Assistance Scheme. At its meeting on 13 November 2017, the Panel agreed to Hon SHIU Ka-chun's similar suggestion.

23. The Low-income Working Family Allowance Scheme

The Administration briefed members at the Panel meeting on 13 November 2017 on the enhancements to the Low-income Working Family Allowance Scheme announced in The Chief Executive's 2017 Policy Address. Welfare services for families, youth and children

29. Welfare measures for facilitating children and youth development

The former Panel agreed to explore whether to discuss the issue "Exploring a way out for young people in respect of welfare, education and employment, etc. under deep-rooted social conflicts in light of the Mongkok Riot occurred on 8 February 2016".

Hon SHIU Ka-chun has suggested discussing as soon as possible the captioned subject matter which also covers the issue mentioned above.

30. Youth suicides

Dr Hon KWOK Ka-ki has suggested that the Panel should consider holding a joint meeting with the HS Panel on youth suicides and relevant social welfare organizations should be invited to give views thereon.

A joint meeting with the HS Panel and the Panel on Education will be held on 20 December 2017 to discuss "Mental health of adolescents" which covers, inter alia, youth suicides.

Social welfare planning and administration

31. Social welfare planning

Mr CHEUNG Kwok-che suggested that the former Panel should discuss social welfare planning.

The former Panel discussed medium and long-term social welfare planning at its meetings on 19 February, 26 March and 8 July 2013. Members suggested that the Panel should discuss with the Administration progress of the subject matter as soon as possible.

Miss CHAN Yuen-han suggested that the Panel should consider discussing the subject of setting targets for the provision of hostels for mentally handicapped persons, e.g. setting a target waiting time and a specific percentage of the total area of a new public housing project for such provision.

Dr Hon Helena WONG suggested that the Panel should discuss planning targets for the provision of child care places and residential care places for elderly persons and persons with disabilities.

Others

44. Charitable fund-raising activities

On 6 December 2013, the Law Reform Commission ("LRC") released its report on charities, which put forward a number of recommendations including those on monitoring charitable fund-raising activities. HAB is coordinating comments from relevant bureaux and departments for formulating the Administration's responses to the report.

The Administration's responses and actions with regard to LRC reports are to be reported to the Panel on Administration of Justice and Legal Services ("the AJLS Panel"). HAB is planning to report progress to the AJLS Panel later when the responses are ready.

The monitoring of charitable fund-raising activities was covered in PAC Report No. 68 published in July 2017.

45. Issues relating to welfare of refugees, torture claimants and asylum seekers and proposed legislative amendments to the unified screening mechanism for non-refoulement claimants

Item proposed by Miss CHAN Yuen-han. She suggested that the Panel should hold a joint meeting with the Panel on Security to discuss the subject matter with the Administration.

The House Committee ("HC") has agreed at its meeting on 28 October 2016 to appoint a subcommittee to follow up issues relating to the Unified Screening Mechanism Non-refoulement Claims. HC noted at its meeting on 1 December 2017 that the Subcommittee would take forward preparatory work for its activation after the coming Lunar New Year towards the end of February 2018.

46. Policies on preventing abuse of elderly persons and of persons with intellectual disabilities

The former Panel suggested that the Panel should discuss policies on preventing abuse of elderly persons in RCHs and of persons with intellectual disabilities in schools/hostels for persons with intellectual disabilities.
