Legislative Council Panel on Welfare Services Meeting on 12 March 2018

Setting up Two New Contract Residential Care Homes for the Elderly and Two New Day Care Centres for the Elderly at a Land Sale Site of Kai Tak Development, Kowloon

Supplementary Information

At the meeting of the Legislative Council Panel on Welfare Services (the Panel) on 12 March 2018, the proposal to set up two new contract residential care homes for the elderly (RCHEs) and two new day care centres for the elderly (DEs) at a land sale site of Kai Tak Development, Kowloon was discussed. Members requested the Government to provide the following information after the meeting -

- (i) the estimated year of service commencement of the new contract RCHEs, contract RCHEs with day care units for the elderly (DCUs) and DEs listed on Annex 2 to the Government's paper (LC Paper No. CB(2)981/17-18(07)); and
- (ii) the policies regarding the planning of welfare facilities in land development projects and land sale projects for private developers.

This note provides the requested information.

- 2. Information on the estimated year of service commencement of new contract RCHEs, contract RCHEs with DCUs and DEs listed in Annex 2 to the Government's paper (LC Paper No. CB(2)981/17-18(07)) is at <u>Annex</u>.
- 3. The Social Welfare Department (SWD) has all along adopted a multi-pronged approach and maintained close liaison with relevant bureaux and departments in identifying suitable locations for the provision of welfare facilities, so as to meet the service needs of various districts in the territory. For private development projects (including land sale sites), the Government will identify suitable sites or projects based on the proposals of relevant bureaux and departments and, where it is feasible from the planning and technical perspectives and justified on genuine needs, include appropriate requirements of

providing the necessary floor area for "Government, Institution or Community" facilities (including welfare facilities) in suitable sites or projects, requiring private developers to construct facilities specified by the Government. As far as welfare facilities are concerned, the construction costs involved will be met by the Lotteries Fund; and SWD will take over the facilities and select a suitable operator upon completion of the construction works. In the planning of welfare facilities, SWD will take account of the needs of the local community, the overall demand for welfare services, the floor area requirements of different welfare facilities, the location and accessibility of the site, as well as the comments from relevant departments on site constraints, development parameters and limitations (including environmental issues such as noise and air quality). The Government will continue to set up welfare facilities in suitable private development projects under the above mechanism.

4. Separately, the Government launched the Scheme to Encourage Provision of Residential Care Home for the Elderly Premises in New Private Developments in July 2003. Under the scheme, eligible RCHE premises proposed will be exempted from payment of premium under different types of land transactions including lease modifications, land exchange and private treaty grants, on the condition that the developers are willing to accept incorporation of certain lease conditions, so as to encourage developers to incorporate RCHEs into their new private developments. The developer will have to pay for the costs of construction and operation of the RCHE. While the RCHE concerned is subject to the monitoring of SWD, its ownership and operating right will belong to the developer.
