Supplementary Information**

Information on Family Support Programme

Integrated Family Service Centres, Integrated Services Centres, Family and Child Protective Services Units, and Medical Social Service Units in psychiatric setting have jointly implemented the “Family Support Programme” (FSP) since 2007, to proactively contact and provide services to the needy families but difficult to reach, including those at the risk of domestic violence or mental illness and those with problems of social isolation, through more intensive support and outreaching service. As at end of March 2018, there were 4 643 volunteers under the FSP while 7 291, 9 355, and 8 135 individual/families were successfully contacted in the year of 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18 respectively. Up to the end of March 2018, under FSP, the cumulative number of individuals/families successfully contacted and provided with support services is 109 955.
