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Reply of the Education Bureau to follow-up issues at the Finance Committee Meeting on 12 October 2018

(i) Detailed breakdown of the number of staff of the Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education (HKAGE) (including teaching staff, administrative staff; number of part-time and full-time staff)

In the 2018/19 school year, the HKAGE has 53 regular posts and 5 non-regular posts. Among them, 40 staff are responsible for teaching work and the relevant divisions/ teams include Academic Programme Development Division, Student Services Team, Advanced Learning Experiences Division, Affective Education Division and Research Division; a total of 18 staff are responsible for administrative work, supporting administration and management affairs of the HKAGE. There are 55 full-time staff and 3 part-time staff.

(ii) Measures taken by the Administration to improve the staff turnover rate of the HKAGE

The Education Bureau (EDB) has exchanged views regularly with the Board of Directors of the HKAGE on the demand for manpower and staff turnover issues, and advised the HKAGE to strengthen communication with its staff through various channels so as to reduce staff turnover rate.

According to the existing arrangement, the HKAGE conducts exit interviews for the leaving staff who have been working in the HKAGE for more than one week in order to understand the reasons for their departure and to alleviate the high turnover rate. It was found that staff turnover was affected by a number of factors, such as whether the staff can adapt to the job nature, operation mode¹ and requirements of the HKAGE, as well as the personal career development considerations (including remuneration package) and their preferences for working environment or location, etc.

The EDB will urge the HKAGE to continue to keep in view and monitor the situation, and provide advice when necessary, to enable the HKAGE to review the problem and put in place improvement measures.

(iii) Detailed breakdown of the expenditure of the HKAGE on staff costs, programme costs and other operating expenses in the past two financial years

Expenditure of the HKAGE on staff costs, programme costs and other operating expenses in the past two accounting years are set out in detail as follows. The actual expenditure in the 2017/18 school year can only be ascertained after the HKAGE's submission of the financial accounts for 2017/18 audited by certified public accountants to the EDB by the end of 2018.

(iv) Measures taken by the Administration to encourage/facilitate gifted students to enrol in the programmes offered by the HKAGE

The EDB has been maintaining close communication with the HKAGE and introducing the programmes and services of the HKAGE to schools, teachers and the public through various channels, including the EDB webpages, gifted education related resource kits / reference materials, professional development programmes for teachers and school visits. Primary and secondary school students can also apply to be student members of the HKAGE and enrol in its programmes through school nomination or self-nomination.

To facilitate students to enrol in the programmes of the HKAGE, the EDB is exploring with the HKAGE to operate some of the STEM programmes at the EDB STEM Education Centre in Kowloon so as to facilitate students to attend classes nearby.
