  - (a) the reports of (i) the review conducted by the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology on the standard permit period assessment ("PPA") templates for utility trench works, which was completed in 2012; and (ii) the follow-up review conducted by the Hong Kong Polytechnic University on the PPA templates for excavation works other than utility trench works, which was completed in 2013; and
  - (b) a full list of the existing locations where trial common utility tunnels are implemented.

3. <u>The Chairman</u> said that the Subcommittee had completed the scrutiny of the Land (Miscellaneous Provisions) (Amendment) Regulation 2018 ("Amendment Regulation").

4. <u>The Chairman</u> reminded members that as agreed at the last meeting, he would move a motion at the Council meeting of 21 November 2018 to extend the scrutiny period of the Amendment Regulation to the Council meeting of 9 January 2019. Upon extension of the scrutiny period, the deadline for giving notice of motion to amend the Amendment Regulation would be 2 January 2019. <u>The Chairman</u> said that he would report the deliberations of the Subcommittee to the House Committee at its meeting on 14 December 2018.

001602 – Chairman 002001 Dr CHIANG Lai-wa Administration	Dr CHIANG Lai-wan	Dr CHIANG Lai-wan expressed concern that, according to Chapter 4: Government's efforts in managing excavation works on public roads of Report No. 70 of the Director of Audit ("Audit Report No. 70"), the number of XPs with the validity period extended had increased by 78% from 727 in 2010 to 1 293 in 2016. The average extension period also increased by 90% from 48 days to 91 days during the period.	
		<ul> <li>The Administration responded that:</li> <li>(a) obstruction by existing underground utilities, difficult underground conditions and inclement weather were common reasons for granting extension of the validity period of an XP ("permit period"); and</li> </ul>	
		(b) for cases where obstruction by existing congested underground utilities had repeatedly led to extensions of permit period in respect of excavation works carried out there previously, HyD would compile statistics and provide information on the degree of congestion of underground utilities of such road sections to utilities undertakings to consider adopting alternative works plan and alignment of the proposed underground utility installations, with a view to avoiding possible delay of the proposed works.

		<ul> <li>(a) the reasons for CNs being rejected might include substandard reinstatement works, late submission of site photographs and test reports by XP permittees, etc.; and</li> </ul>	
		(b) HyD had been closely following up with utility undertakings on the quality of their reinstatement works, and the timely submission of site photographs and test reports for HyD to determine whether the standard of their reinstatement works was to HyD's satisfaction.
