Action

I. Election of Chairman

Election of Chairman

Mr Frankie YICK, the member who had the highest precedence among members of the Subcommittee present at the meeting, presided over the election of the Chairman of the Subcommittee. He invited nominations for the chairmanship of the Subcommittee.

- 2. Mr Frankie YICK was nominated by Mr CHAN Han-pan, and the nomination was seconded by Mr YIU Si-wing. Mr Frankie YICK accepted the nomination.
- 3. As Mr Frankie YICK was nominated for the office, Mr YIU Si-wing, the member present who had the highest precedence among the members not nominated for the office, presided over the election of the Chairman. There being no other nominations, Mr YIU Si-wing declared that Mr Frankie YICK was elected as Chairman of the Subcommittee. Mr YICK then took the chair.

Election of Deputy Chairman

- 4. <u>The Chairman</u> indicated that he might move a motion later at the meeting regarding the three regulations to exempt the toll for franchised buses using government tunnels as well as the Tsing Ma and Tsing Sha Control Areas ("the Three Regulations"). He proposed and <u>members</u> agreed to elect a Deputy Chairman of the Subcommittee to facilitate dealing with his motion.
- 5. <u>The Chairman</u> called for nominations for the deputy chairmanship of the Subcommittee. Mr YIU Si-wing was nominated by <u>Mr CHAN Han-pan</u> and the nomination was seconded by <u>Mr Tony TSE</u>. <u>Mr YIU Si-wing</u> accepted the nomination. There being no other nominations, <u>Mr YIU Si-wing</u> was declared elected as the Deputy Chairman of the Subcommittee.

II. Meeting with the Administration

Discussion

6. <u>The Administration</u> briefed members on the Three Regulations. <u>The Subcommittee</u> deliberated (index of proceedings is in the **Appendix**).

Follow-up actions to be taken by the Administration

- 7. <u>The Subcommittee</u> requested the Administration to provide the following information:
 - (a) the Administration's response to the suggestion of directly reducing the fares for selected franchised bus routes using government tunnels as well as the Tsing Ma and Tsing Sha Control Areas, instead of setting up the "Franchised Bus Toll Exemption Fund" to mitigate the fare increase for all bus routes of individual franchised bus operators; and
 - (b) whether further legislative amendments are required for exempting the toll for all franchised buses using Western Harbour Crossing and Tai Lam Tunnel after the Government's takeover of the above two tunnels when their franchises expire in 2023 and 2025 respectively.

Motion

(At 9:28 am, the Deputy Chairman chaired the meeting to handle the motion moved by the Chairman.)

8. <u>The Deputy Chairman</u> having decided that the proposed motion was directly related to the Subcommittee's deliberations, <u>the Subcommittee</u> agreed to deal with the motion moved by the Chairman and seconded by Mr CHAN Han-pan as follows:

有鑒於非專營巴士(居民服務)和綠色專線小巴與專營巴士同樣面對營運成本不斷上升的問題,而非專營巴士(居民服務)和綠色專線小巴的票價及路線同樣受政府監管,因此,本會要求政府把非專營巴士(居民服務)和綠色專線小巴納入在豁免政府隧道以及青馬和青沙管制區的收費計劃內,以減輕兩者的加價壓力。

(Translation)

As non-franchised buses (residents' service ("RS")) and green minibuses ("GMBs"), same as franchised buses, are facing the problem of rising operating costs, and the fares and routings of non-franchised buses (RS) and GMBs are also regulated by the Government, this Subcommittee calls upon the Government to include non-franchised

buses (RS) and GMBs in the plan to exempt the toll for using government tunnels as well as the Tsing Ma and Tsing Sha Control Areas with a view to relieving their fare increase pressure.

9. <u>The Deputy Chairman</u> put the motion to vote. Two members voted for the motion and no member voted against it. <u>The Deputy Chairman</u> declared that the motion was carried.

(At 9:29 am, the Chairman took over the Chairmanship.)

10. Understanding that the suggestion set out in the motion might have charging effect for the purposes of Rule 31(1) of the Rules of Procedure in reducing government revenue which might be collected under statutory authority (i.e. the Road Tunnels (Government) Regulations (Cap. 368A)), the Subcommittee agreed that it would not propose amendment to the Three Regulations in this regard but requested the Administration to note the Subcommittee's suggestion.

(*Post-meeting note*: The supplementary information provided by the Administration as well as its response to the motion passed at the meeting were circulated to members on 24 December 2018 via LC Paper No. CB(4)367/18-19(02). By the deadline on 28 December 2018, no members raised query on the above paper.)

Examination of the provisions of the three regulations to exempt the toll for franchised buses using government tunnels as well as the Tsing Ma and Tsing Sha Control Areas

11. <u>The Subcommittee</u> completed examination of the provisions of the Three Regulations and would not propose any amendment.

Invitation of views

12. <u>Members</u> agreed that there was no need to invite the public to give views on the Three Regulations.

Legislative timetable

13. <u>Members</u> noted that the scrutiny period of the Three Regulations had been extended by resolution to the Council meeting of 23 January 2019. The deadline for giving notice of amendments was 16 January 2019. The Chairman would report the deliberations of the Subcommittee to the House Committee on 11 January 2019.

III. Any other business

14. There being no other business, the meeting ended at 9:51 am.
