## **Legislative Council Panel on Education**

Payment for the examination fees for school candidates sitting for the 2020 Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination

## **Purpose**

This paper aims to seek Members' support for a one-off measure to pay the examination fees for school candidates sitting for the 2020 Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination (HKDSE).

### **Proposal**

2. The Financial Secretary announced in the 2019-20 Budget a series of relief measures, including paying the examination fees for school candidates sitting for the 2020 HKDSE (the Proposal).

## **Eligibility**

3. To be eligible for government's payment of examination fees, a candidate must be enrolled in a registered school approved for participation in the 2020 HKDSE in the 2019/20 school year and be entered as a school candidate in the 2020 HKDSE through his/her school, regardless of whether he/she is a first-time candidate or is repeating part or whole of the senior secondary curriculum in a day school or evening school.

## Coverage of subsidy

4. The examination fees covered under the Proposal include the subject fees of Category A (Senior Secondary) subjects, Category B

(Applied Learning) subjects and Category C (Other Languages) subjects for the 2020 HKDSE, but exclude the supplementary fees<sup>1</sup>. A list of Category A, Category B and Category C subjects for the 2020 HKDSE is at the **Annex**.

#### Calculation of examination fees

- 5. The subject fees are categorised into "language subjects" and "other subjects". "Language subjects" refer to Chinese Language and English Language subjects under Category A as well as six other language subjects under Category C. "Other subjects" are the remaining subjects of Category A and all subjects under Category B. For the 2020 HKDSE, the examination fees to be charged by the Hong Kong Examinations and Assessment Authority (HKEAA) are \$670 for language subjects and \$448 for other subjects. For example, if an eligible school candidate enters for 2 language subjects and 4 other subjects, the amount payable by the Government for the candidate will be \$3,132.
- 6. It is estimated that about 45 900 school candidates will sit for the 2020 HKDSE and will benefit from the Proposal.

## **Implementation Plan**

7. The registration and preparation work for the HKDSE normally starts in June every year and the examination period is from March to May in the following year, except for the Category C subjects which will be conducted in October to November<sup>2</sup>. The registration is conducted in two periods, namely June and September of the year before the year of the examination for Category C subjects and Categories A and B subjects respectively. Candidates are required to make payment for entries in Category C subjects in July, and for Categories A and B subjects in October of the year before the year of the examination respectively. The 2020 HKDSE follows the same schedule.

Examples of supplementary fees are fees for late entry, fees for addition/ change of subject entry, fees for re-scheduling of oral examinations, application fees for rechecking and remarking, appeal review, and data access request, etc. to be paid by the candidates. 8. The HKEAA will issue notices to schools about the administrative details of the registration for the 2020 HKDSE and upload the "Instructions to Applicants" onto the HKEAA's website around one week before the start of the registration periods (i.e. in early June and early September 2019) according to the prevailing practice.

## **Financial Implication**

9. We plan to make payment of the examination fees for eligible candidates directly to the HKEAA, largely in accordance with the normal payment schedule of school candidates as in past years. Based on the estimated number of school candidates for the 2020 HKDSE and the estimated number of subjects entered by a school candidate (i.e. 2 language subjects and 3 to 6 other subjects), the estimated financial implication of the payment of the examination fees to the HKEAA on behalf of school candidates is around \$160 million. A tentative breakdown of the expenditure is set out as follows -

The expenditure covers payment for some 45 900 eligible school candidates each entering for 2 language subjects at a fee of \$670 per subject.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup> With reference to the registration statistics of school candidates in the past HKDSEs, it is estimated that around 10%, 70% and 20% of school candidates will enter for 3 or fewer, 4 and 5 or 6 other subjects respectively in the 2020 HKDSE. The expenditure covers payment for the subject fees of \$448 each for 3 to 6 other subjects entered by some 45 900 eligible school candidates.

The contingency is mainly for accommodating extra payment in case the percentage of candidates taking a larger number of subjects is higher than in previous years.

10. The actual total amount of payment to the HKEAA will be determined by the actual number of subject entries of eligible school candidates for the 2020 HKDSE. The expenditure will be incurred mainly in 2019-20 following the normal payment schedule of the 2020 HKDSE, but there may be cases of late entries for addition/substitution of subjects accepted under exceptional circumstances at the time near to or during the examination period, for which the payment of subject fees will be incurred in 2020-21.

11. The estimated cash flow for the proposed payment is set out as follows –

#### **Related Issue**

12. At present, eligible non-Chinese speaking (NCS) students<sup>6</sup> enrolled in Secondary 4 to 6 at day schools pursuing the local curriculum are only required to pay a "subsidised examination fee" on a par with that of the HKDSE (Chinese Language) Examination for participation in internationally recognised alternative Chinese Language qualifications examinations <sup>7</sup>. With the proposal of paying the examination fees for school candidates sitting for the 2020 HKDSE, the "subsidised examination fee" of eligible NCS students sitting for the aforementioned examinations in the 2019/20 school year will be waived accordingly. The Education Bureau will deploy existing resources to meet the funding requirement arising from the waiver of the "subsidised examination fee" for eligible NCS students, which is estimated to be about \$2 million. Related arrangements including

application procedures and payment of subsidies will basically follow the established mechanism.

## **Advice Sought**

13. Members are invited to give views and advice on the Proposal. Subject to Members' comments, we plan to seek funding approval from the Finance Committee of the Legislative Council as soon as possible, such that the HKEAA can prepare for the registration for Category C subjects in the 2020 HKDSE (which will take place in June 2019) on the basis that the examination fees will be paid by the Government.

## **Background**

14. The Financial Secretary proposed to pay the examination fees for candidates sitting for the 2019 HKDSE in the 2018-19 Budget, which has been smoothly implemented. Having regard to the economic outlook in the coming year and the Government's fiscal position, the Financial Secretary proposed in the 2019-20 Budget to pay the examination fees for candidates sitting for the 2020 HKDSE.
