11. Community Care Fund	25.6.2018	The Hospital Authority agreed to provide the information on the costs for subsidizing the three drugs (i.e. Nivolumab, Obinutuzumab and Nusinersen) under the First phase programme of medical assistance programmes and the programme of Subsidy for eligible patients to purchase ultra-expensive drugs (including those for treating uncommon disorders) once available.
