1. Measures for handling of riots

Item proposed by Dr Hon Elizabeth QUAT in her letter of 23 February 2016 (LC Paper No. CB(2)966/15-16(01)). Dr QUAT proposed at the meeting on 28 October 2016 that issues relating to the enactment of legislation against the wearing of masks in public meetings and public processions be discussed by the Panel.

Dr Hon Helena WONG proposed at the meeting on 28 October 2016 that the Panel should follow up the Police's investigation into the clashes between the Police and the public in Mong Kok in the early hours of 9 February 2016.

A letter dated 8 November 2016 from Hon Nathan LAW on issues relating to the Police's review regarding clashes between the Police and the public in Mong Kok in the early hours of 9 February 2016 was circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)133/16-17 on 9 November 2016.

Hon Michael TIEN proposed in his letter of 12 October 2018 (LC Paper No. CB(2)143/18-19(01)) that the enactment of legislation against the wearing of masks in public meetings and public processions be discussed by the Panel.

2. Prosecution under section 161 of the Crimes Ordinance (Cap. 200) concerning access to computer with criminal or dishonest intent

At the work plan meeting of the Chairman and the Deputy Chairman with the Secretary for Security on 8 November 2016, the Administration was requested to provide a paper on the subject and the progress of the Administration's review on the offence of "access to computer with criminal or dishonest intent". The Administration's paper was circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)2189/16-17 on 10 October 2017.

3. Enactment of legislation against insulting police officers To be confirmed

Item proposed by Hon Michael TIEN and Dr Hon Elizabeth QUAT at the meeting on 28 October 2016.

At the work plan meeting of the Chairman and the Deputy Chairman with the Secretary for Security on 8 November 2016, the Administration was requested to provide a paper regarding its views on the subject. The Administration's paper was circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)2189/16-17 on 10 October 2017.

4. Installation of video cameras inside police vehicles and mechanism for handling complaints against police officers To be confirmed

Dr Hon Helena WONG and Hon Nathan LAW proposed at the meeting on 28 October 2016 that the mechanism for handling complaints against police officers and the role of the Independent Police Complaints Council be

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discussed by the Panel. Dr WONG also proposed that to facilitate the investigation of complaints relating to incidents inside police vehicles by the Complaints Against Police Office, the issue of installation of video cameras inside police vehicles be discussed by the Panel.

At the work plan meeting of the Chairman and the Deputy Chairman with the Secretary for Security on 8 November 2016, the Administration was requested to provide a paper regarding its views on the subject and the issue of installation of video cameras inside police vehicles. The Administration's paper was circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)2189/16-17 on 10 October 2017.

A letter dated 25 October 2018 from Hon James TO regarding the installation of video cameras inside police vehicles was circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)164/18-19(01) on 31 October 2018.

A letter dated 3 May 2018 from ICAC on its management succession had been circulated to members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)1344/17-18(01) on 4 May 2018.

CB(2)1309/16-17 and CB(2)2114/16-17 on 19 June and 25 September 2017 respectively. At the meeting on 12 October 2017, Dr Hon Fernando CHEUNG suggested that the issues concerned be discussed by the Panel.

At the meeting between the Chairman, the Deputy Chairman and the Secretary for Security to discuss the work plan of the Panel for the 2018-2019 session held on 24 October 2018, it was agreed that Hon Alvin YEUNG's draft Member's Bill entitled "State of Disaster Bill 2018" would be discussed together with the subject of progress of review of the handling of typhoons following Super Typhoon Mangkhut.

23. Specialized Crowd Management Vehicles
