### Panel on Food Safety and Environmental Hygiene Subcommittee to Study Issues Relating to Animal Rights The Government's Response to Follow-up Actions Raised by the Subcommittee

Thank you for the Secretariat's letter dated 8 April 2021. In response to the matters raised by Members at the Subcommittee meeting on 22 March 2021, the Government's response is set out as follows.

- (a) Among Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department's (AFCD) 17 rehoming partners, 10 of them provide animal rehoming/shelter facilities, handling dogs, cats, rabbits and reptiles etc. We understand these animal welfare organisations (AWO) (not including the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (Hong Kong) (SPCA)) can in total accommodate up to around 820 dogs, 220 cats, 80 rabbits and 300 reptiles. Furthermore, over the past 3 years, SPCA collected or rescued on average around 1 000 dogs, 1 700 cats and 2 700 other animals every year. The Government does not have an exhaustive list of AWOs that provide animal rehoming/shelter facilities in Hong Kong.
- (b) AFCD provides financial assistance to AWOs under a subvention scheme, to conduct projects related to promotion of animal welfare

and animal management, including establishing and operating rehoming centres and publicity programmes, to enhance public awareness on responsible pet ownership, animal welfare and adoption, etc. Please refer to **Annex** for subvention provided to AWOs under said scheme in the past three years. In addition, AFCD provides subvention to SPCA, to support activities and programmes related to stray animal management, combating animal cruelty, public education on animal welfare, etc. In 2018-19, AFCD provided subvention of \$1 million to SPCA, whilst in 2019-20 and 2020-21, annual subvention of \$1.5 million was provided to SPCA.

Furthermore, the Development Bureau manages the Funding Scheme to Support the Use of Vacant Government Sites by Non-government Organisations and has approved a total funding of around \$18 million, as well as short-term tenancies at nominal rent, to support two rehoming partners to construct animal re-homing shelters on vacant government sites.

(c) According to the 2018 Thematic Household Survey Report No. 66, 82.3% of dogs kept by households were de-sexed (182 000/221 100), whilst 77.2% of cats kept by households were de-sexed (142 100/184 100).
