5. Kai Tak Sports Park

HAB submitted a progress report on KTSP to the Panel on 23 April 2019 [LC Paper No. CB(2)1266/18-19(01)] covering the key design features of the winning tender, key contractual requirements, project governance and timetable as well as the fixed payment schedule by the contractor, master layout plan, examples of key sport facilities and current hiring charge of similar facilities, etc. Construction of the project is currently underway. A site visit was conducted on 31 August 2021 to KTSP for Panel members to understand the progress in the implementation of the design and construction for KTSP. The Administration will provide progress report when appropriate.
