International Character

• Strongly emphasise our strengths and ability to stand tall as a Chinese city but must guard against allowing the pendulum to swing too far and becoming inward looking, xenophobic or protective

Action:

• Sell the concept: develop a coordinated campaign

External Promotion

• To speak with one voice, to articulate with authority what our vision and ambitions are, and to emphasise our advantages

Action:

• One Secretary to coordinate all external activities

Environment & Quality of Life

• Upgrade environment & allocate resources for a cleaner & greener HK

- Establish an environmental task force chaired by the Chief Secretary for Administration
- Collaborate closely with Mainland authorities
- Enhance enforcement

Education & Language

- Primary & secondary education reform
- Student's English & Putonghua capability improvement
- A regional centre for higher education and research

- Implement Education Review recommendations
- Expand practical English adult education
- Expand non-local university undergraduate intake

Immigration


• Encourage and facilitate talented people to come to HK


THE TOP TEN MOST COSTLY CITIES IN THE WORLD

Broadening the Economy

• Capture emerging opportunities brought about by new technology and economic development in the Mainland

Action:

• Forward planning and coordination between the Executive Authorities, the Legislature, the business community, the universities and other institutions

Mainland Cooperation

• Seek support from the Mainland for HK to become China's most international city

- Long term planning and coordination for Mainland support
- Effective mechanisms for dialogue with Mainland counterparts

Leadership

• Government to assume a more pro-active leadership role during difficult times

Action:

• Set strategic objectives and direction but not to pick winners

A World Financial Centre

- Strengthen our financial and monetary sector
- Maintain our prominence as regional multinational headquarters location
- Enhance our status as a transportation hub

A World Financial Centre

- Strengthen debt market
- Establish multicurrency clearing system
- Encourage mutlicurrency stock trading
- Support second board of stock exchange

A Leading Commercial City in China

- Maintain HK as a vibrant and growing manufacturing control centre
- Expand our capabilities in high technology, research and development
- Create an atmosphere conducive to the growth of small and medium enterprises

A Leading Commercial City in China

Action

Manufacturing Sector

- Promote HK as the manufacturing control centre
- Foster an environment and providing the infrastructure for partnership between universities and manufacturers
- Strengthen cross border liaison
- Enhance support to small and medium enterprises
- Assist HK business to train human resources in Southern China

A Leading Commercial City in China

Action

Transportation & Shipping

- Establish Pearl River Delta Transportation Coordinating Committee
- Assist industry to reduce cost of shipping
- Establish HK as the region's leading distribution centre
- Assess air service liberalisation
- Improve training and education

- The professional services: its future strength vital in maintaining HK's competitiveness
- Telecommunications, media and information sectors (TMI): HK with a high potential to become a regional centre
- Travel and tourism: position HK as a hub destination

Action

Professional Services

- Professional bodies to consult with tertiary institutions to establish accreditation
- Implement open door policy to attract quality professionals
- Develop HK as a medical hub

Action

Telecommunications, Media & Information (TMI)

- Target TMI related investment
- Review IT related legislations
- Enhance public IT facilities
- Enhance public e-commerce

Action

Travel & Tourism

- Prepare tourism planning policy
- Establish tourism research centre
- Extend travel trade legislation to address abuses

Human Resources & Technology

- Keep abreast of high technology
- Expand training facilities
- HK to become a centre of research and development
- Enhance higher education and training

Research and Development

- A bureau to coordinate initiatives to support advances in science & technology
- Establish collaboration projects with Mainland institutions

• Financially assist Mainland students
