

Report on
The Admission of Talents Scheme
(From 17 December 1999 to 15 March 2000)

Employment applications

The Scheme was implemented on 17 December 1999. As at 15 March 2000, 90 entry applications for employment were received. Six applications were approved and 25 applications refused/withdrawn. The remaining 59 applications are still under processing because some employers and candidates have not submitted all necessary supporting documents.

Breakdown of approval cases

Employment field

Two are in the field of information technology. Of them, one is responsible for formulating and implementing policy for research and development on hi-tech products suitable for use locally and overseas. The other is responsible for designing international complex backbone networking. Two are in the field of multi-media technology responsible for the development of new technology in the production of digital versatile disc. One pertained to engineering field responsible for designing and overseeing the implementation of the company's engineering technique with specialty in low costing method and in China market. One related to the finance sector responsible for giving expert advice and assessment on investment relating to high technology, bio-chemical engineering and Chinese medicine fields.

Employers

Five employing companies with paid up capital in the range of HK\$1 million to around HK\$500 million.

Education attainment

Two are holders of doctoral degree. One is a holder of master degree with professional qualification as economist, many professional publications in finance sector, and full working experience in finance field. Three are holders of bachelor degree with outstanding achievements/abilities. Of them, one has outstanding achievements recognised in information technology field, and widely publicised in local press. The other two have full working experience and knowledge in new technology which are not available locally as advised by the Industry Department.

Monthly remuneration

Three are in the range of HK\$20,001 to HK\$50,000, and the remaining three are in the range of HK\$80,001 to HK\$120,000.
