The Bill seeks to require all primary and secondary school students to do physical exercise for at least one hour a day in school. Hong Kong school children lack exercise as they spend long hours on study and schoolwork, surfing the Internet and playing online games. Research results show that more than 20% of Hong Kong students are overweight, and their overall physical fitness performance is not as good as that of their counterparts in the Mainland, Singapore and Europe. Hong Kong students need to build up a good physique by doing more exercise. If the Bill is passed, students will have no excuse for not doing exercise ... (Student may come up with more points of

his/her own) Therefore, I urge Members to support the Bill.

Hence, even some students do not like sports, they are already required to attend physical education class weekly.
